Please join me in welcoming Fr. Peter Angaalre among us. Fr. Peter is a priest of the Arch-Diocese of Tamale in Ghana. He will be staying with us to cover weekly and weekend masses while I am on a vacation in Ghana. It is my prayer and hope that his time with us at Sacred Heart and our local community will be an enjoyable and fruitful one.

Today's readings talk about God's plan of salvation for us and our individual call to labor in his vineyard for the salvation of souls.

In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah spoke words of hope, comfort, and joy to his fellow Jews who suffered many years of captivity in Babylon. Those in exile returned home and were faced with the daunting task of rebuilding their life and their holy city Jerusalem. Isaiah counseled them to be optimistic. God will spread prosperity over his people like a river. He will restore Jerusalem to her former glory and the people will find comfort.

All of us yearn for God's divine plan to come true for us. We yearn for a world where all people will seek the good of each other and bring an end to suffering, injustice, violence and war. We have a Christian duty to flood the world with the gospel message, to bring people to know Christ and to walk in the light of his truth.

In the gospel, Jesus sent the seventy-two out in pairs to towns and villages to spread the good news, to heal, and to cure the sick. Jesus wanted them to be concerned about the missionary work of evangelization. He instructed the disciples to travel light. They were to carry no money bag, no sack or sandals with them. The disciples were to trust in God and depend on the hospitality and generosity of the people to whom they are sent.

The seventy-two returned rejoicing at their accomplishments. The devil could not withstand the power behind their preaching and healing ministry. But Jesus cautioned them against complacency. He urged them to make sure that their names are written in heaven. The mission of Christ remains important at all times. The demand for more workers in the Lord's vineyard is great. Jesus made it clear that the harvest is plenty but the laborers are few. There is the need to bring the gospel message to many places. In some places people have received the good news but more profound work needs to be done. It is sad that in some countries like our own people are turning away from the faith.

God calls each one of us to spend our lives in his loving service. He invites us to live for him and for others

As we observe our Nation's Independence this weekend, let us do so with gratitude thanking God for our brave men and women who paid the great price for our freedoms and the benefits we enjoy today. Please remember to thank a military service member or a veteran when you see one. They need our gratitude and every kind deed.

Let us pray for them and all those who continue to sacrifice their lives for our safety that they will know God's protection and share in his eternal peace and happiness.

All of us know the many challenges facing us as a nation. We are faced with prejudice, racial injustice, gun violence, and economic inequality. As people of faith we need the power of righteousness to guide us to rise up and to overcome the darkness of evil that surrounds us. Let us live out the values of God's kingdom and through our words and actions transform minds and hearts to help build a society where truth, justice, and peace will remain triumphant. I wish all of you a Happy Fourth of July.
