### 15<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Sacred Heart Parish reached its' One-Hundredth Year of Catholic Worship last year June 2021. A check on our Archives shows that Sacred Heart Church was founded on June 4, 1921. And thanks to one of our longtime parishioners who prompted me and the pastoral council members about this major milestone. Unfortunately due to the Covid-19 Pandemic we could not make any arrangements to celebrate our Centennial Anniversary last year.

This year we have every reason to celebrate the history of our parish and to give thanks to God for the faith, vision, and hard work of those who came before us.

In 100 years, our fathers and mothers, grandfathers and grandmothers, friends, and neighbors, have labored for the development and the growth of our parish community. Their sacrifices, hard work and faithful service are worth celebrating and inspire us to follow their lead. And so with eagerness and joy I announce to you that we will celebrate our Centennial Anniversary with a Special Mass of Thanksgiving on Sunday, September 18, 2022 at 10:30 am and followed by fellowship and refreshments in the Parish Center.

We have already extended an invitation to Bishop Edward B. Scharfenberger to preside over the Eucharistic celebration and to grace our anniversary with his presence. We will also invite past pastors and other dignitaries to join us to celebrate this important occasion with us. We hope that they will honor our invitations and join us to give thanks for God's steadfast love and kindness upon our parish family.

While I am on a vacation, the pastoral council will continue the planning process. Some of the council members may approach you for your input or ideas regarding the celebration of our Anniversary. I ask that you please give them your every help in this matter. Thank you.

Today's liturgy deals with the subject of love of God and love of neighbor.

In the first reading, Moses instructed the people of Israel to heed the voice of the Lord and keep his commandments and statutes. He reminded them and all of us that God's commandments are not remote but rather on our lips and in our hearts to carry them out.

The Psalmist tells us to turn to the Lord in our need so we can live.

Saint Paul reminds us in the second reading that Jesus is the image of the invincible God, the first born of all creation. Jesus reconciled all things in himself and made peace by his death on the cross.

In the gospel, Jesus teaches us that keeping the commandments is not a matter of focusing on the details regarding what is right or wrong but rather acting with love and compassion. He told the story of the traveler who was attacked by robbers and stripped, beaten, and left half-dead. Along came a priest and a Levite who saw the fellow but passed by on the other side of the road. Both the priest and the Levite allowed fear to prevent them from drawing near to help the victim out. They did not want to touch the man in case he was dead and ritually defile themselves.

A Good Samaritan came that way and he proved himself a true neighbor to the victim. He stopped and bandaged his wounds and took care of him.

Jesus used this story to teach the scholar of the law and all of us who our neighbor is and what we need to do to inherit eternal life. He calls us to be Good Samaritans, to be courageous to break all boundaries and to reach out in love and compassion to all who cross our path each day. There are those who need our helping hands of time, love and care. Let us not pass by them but rather reach out to offer them helping hands. Let us in this Eucharistic celebration ask the Lord to renew our strength, free us from fear and self-concern and bring each one of us to give ourselves in loving service to him and others. And may the light of God's love bring us always to walk on the path that leads to eternal life.

### Feast Day of Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, July 14<sup>th</sup>



St. Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American to be recognized as a saint by the Catholic Church. She was born in 1656, in the Mohawk village of Ossernenon. At age 19, Kateri Tekakwitha converted to Catholicism, taking a vow of chastity and pledging to marry only Jesus Christ. Sadly, just five years after her conversion to Catholicism, she became ill and passed away at age 24, on April 17, 1680. Her name, Kateri, is the

Mohawk form of Catherine, which she took from St. Catherine of Siena. St. Kateri Tekakwitha was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on Oct. 21, 2012. She is the patroness of ecology and the environment, people in exile and Native Americans.
