Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

This idea crossed my mind while contemplating on the feast of this Trinity Sunday. I thought of this idea that if not always, every once in a while we Catholic Christians should pat ourselves on the back for our capacity to live in mystery and with mystery. As we know it there are certain divinely revealed truths that we embrace and live out through the act of faith.

The Holy Trinity is one great mystery that we accept as a divinely revealed truth. Our Catholic faith rests on this fundamental truth of One in Trinity and Trinity in One. Today we gather to celebrate our belief in this great mystery of the nature, grandeur, and beauty of God. We worship and give glory to God who is a community of Persons who live in mutual love. The doctrine of the Holy Trinity teaches us that there is one God but seen and worshiped in three Divine Persons. God is the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. He is a community of perfect unity. It is so beautiful that all three Divine Persons are acknowledged as co-equal in eternity, power, honor and knowledge. The Godhead shares in each other's life. Each belongs to the other. There is no competition or conflict among them. God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit work together for the redemption and salvation of the world.

The fact remains that the Holy Trinity is not a mathematical puzzle or a philosophical problem to be solved but rather a mystery to encounter and live out. In our limited minds we can never comprehend the inner life of God. But we are drawn into the life of the Triune God. The Holy Trinity is more like an ocean in which we all swim. Just think of the sign of the Cross we make, the sacraments of baptism and confirmation we received, and the prayers we say or offer. We invoke the Trinity in everything we do. We call on the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit in every moment.

And thanks to our Christian faith which brings us to see the riches of God's wisdom and to search for this gift and live it out. In the first reading, the book of Proverbs speaks of wisdom as God's companion. The author of the book of proverbs perceives Wisdom as begotten by God at the beginning of creation. Wisdom works with God and finds delight in the human race. Jesus is the embodiment of Wisdom. He is the one who came to reveal the face of his father to us. Jesus showed us the infinite love and compassion of God. He is aware of the limits of our human minds. In the gospel, Jesus said to his disciples that he has much more to tell them but they cannot bear it now. He understands our need of his constant presence, that is why he asked his father to send us the Holy Spirit to guide us to all truth. Jesus filled this promise at Pentecost by sending the Holy Spirit upon his Apostles. As recipients of this gift we are called to witness to the beauty of the love and the harmony that exist within the Godhead. Let us pray that our celebration of this great mystery will bring us to live as people bounded in love, harmony, and perfect unity within our family and community. Let us ask God to grant us the gift of peace through our faith in the mystery of the Holy Trinity.
