Feast of Corpus Christi

We are blessed as a people with the gift of faith that brings us each day to see and appreciate God's wondrous love for us. God blesses our lives with good things by satisfying our physical and spiritual hungers in abundance.

Today marks the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, traditionally known as Corpus Christi. In some countries this feast is celebrated on the Thursday after Holy Trinity Sunday. But for us here in the U.S. and our sisters and brothers elsewhere we observe the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ this Sunday.

What we celebrate today is our belief in the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. As Catholics we believe that at every Mass Jesus becomes sacramentally present in the Eucharist under the appearances of bread and wine. We firmly believe that during the consecration the bread and wine change into the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest.

Today we renew our belief in the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. We offer our pledge of undivided love and devotion to Him in the Most Blessed Sacrament.

The readings for today's feast talk about how God reaches out to each one of us to satisfy our physical and spiritual hungers.

In first reading, Melchizedek, who was a king and a priest offered a sacrifice of bread and wine to God as the creator and sustainer of human life. Abraham offered a tenth of his possessions as a sacrifice to God. In his role as a priest of the Most High God, Melchizedek blessed Abraham for his act of faith and generous giving.

In today's gospel, Jesus demonstrated himself as one who came to satisfy our spiritual and physical hungers on our pilgrimage of life. He took what was little and multiplied it to feed the hungry crowd. Jesus welcomed the crowd and shared the word of God with them. He cured those who were sick. As evening drew near, the disciples suggested to Jesus to dismiss the crowd so they can go to the nearby villages to buy something to eat and to look for lodging. But Jesus challenged his disciples to give them something to eat themselves. He taught them that it is part of their mission to announce the kingdom of God and to share whatever resources they have with the needy and the hungry.

The disciples brought all that they had to Jesus, five loaves and two fish. Jesus took the loaves and the fish and then looked up to heaven. He gave thanks, broke them and asked his disciples to distribute them to the hungry crowd. So amazing! They all ate and were filled. What seemed impossible became possible. There were some leftovers, twelve baskets full.

Jesus teaches us a lesson that sharing increases possibilities. He shows us that sharing opens the door for us to receive God's blessing. He calls us to follow his path of service, sharing and self-giving.

Like the crowd we recognize our brokenness and our need for healing.

We meet around the table of the Lord to be nourished by his eternal word and the bread of life. We seek to live what we celebrate, to be the bread broken and a cup shared with others. We seek to be the hands of Jesus Christ to reach out to those who need our love and our prayers.

This weekend, we observe Father's Day. Let us show our appreciation for all our fathers for the special role they play in our lives. Let us remember them in prayer asking that God may bless their lives with health, love, peace, and success in all their endeavors.

In recognition of Father's Day we will offer special blessings for all our fathers at all of our masses this weekend.

I wish all our Fathers, Happy Father's Day! Keep up with your good work in being there for others, especially your children, family, and community.
