We are in the second week of our Advent journey. Today, we light the first and the second purple candles on our Advent wreath representing our longing for hope and peace in our lives and the world.

The readings for this second Sunday of Advent call us to remove the things that hinder us from drawing closer to God. The readings urge us to repent from our sinful ways and be renewed in God's grace and holiness.

In the first reading, the prophet Baruch proclaimed a message of hope and comfort to his despairing people in exile. He called them to take off their robe of mourning and misery because their redemption was near at hand. He assured the exiles in Babylon that God would intervene in their situation, set them free and lead them safely home to Jerusalem.

The message of Baruch is our advent invitation. We too are like the ancient people of Israel wandering and suffering in exile. We suffer from the slavery to sin. Our human weaknesses impede the grace which God desires to bestow on us. Our sins cause us shame and pain.

Advent calls us to turn to God for repentance, forgiveness, and restoration. The holy season invites us to take off the dress of sorrow and distress and step into the bright light of Christ. In the gospel, John the Baptist tells us to turn to the right path. John the Baptist proclaimed a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins to the people of his time. He echoed the prophecy of Isaiah "Prepare the way of the Lord and make straight his paths" (Isaiah 40:3).

We all have mountains and hills in our lives that need to be lowered. Our crooked ways need to be straightened out. We have mountains of hate to bring down and deep valleys of pride, prejudice and indifference to fill in with humility, openness, love, respect, acceptance, and care.

In the second reading, Saint Paul gave thanks to God for the Christian community of Philippians. He prayed that the Christians may be filled with joy as they waited for the day of the Lord. He was hopeful that God will bring the good work in the believers to complete fruition. Saint Paul had affection for all of them and wishes the same for us.

God planted the seed of faith in each of us at the time of our baptism. He wants us to keep growing in love and faith and trust in his bigger plan for us. Each day we need to cooperate with God and follow his path. In this time of waiting and joyful hope and anticipation, let us seek to renew and deepen our relationship with God. Let us return to the Lord in the sacrament of reconciliation so we can experience forgiveness, freedom, and peace in our lives.
