Divine Mercy Sunday: Be a living witness of God's mercy and love in the world

We continue to rejoice in the resurrection of the Lord. By his death and resurrection, the Lord has opened the gate of eternal salvation to all of us. He has given us hope that we will be raised up on the last day.

On this second Sunday of Easter, also called Divine Mercy Sunday our scripture readings invite us to contemplate the power of God's mercy, compassion, forgiveness, and peace in our lives. The readings teach us to value the importance of faith, healing, and renewal in our lives.

In the gospel, the risen Lord appeared to his disciples to dispel their fears and offer them the gift of peace. The disciples were gathered in the upper room behind locked doors for fear of the Jewish leaders. Jesus breathed his spirit upon them and gave them the authority to forgive sins. Thomas was absent when the Lord made his first appearance to the disciples. He was told the joyful news when he later joined the rest of the disciples, but he rejected their testimony. Thomas demanded tangible evidence before believing the resurrection news. He got more than he asked for when the Lord appeared to the disciples the second time and invited him to come and touch his sacred wounds.

This incident stunned Thomas and moved him from unbelief to belief. It brought him to make his profound act of faith. Thomas exclaimed: "My Lord and my God." Jesus quizzed this disciple and all of us, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe" (John 2:29).

All of us have Thomas in us. Sometimes we wrestle with faith and doubt. We ask hard questions about our faith and search for answers. We have moments when doubt threatens to diminish our faith. Our Lord Jesus exhorts all of us to surrender our unbelief and place our faith and trust in him.

In the first reading, we learn how the Apostles placed their trust in the Lord and continued his mission on earth. The Apostles became instruments and vessels of God's mercy and love for the world. They performed many signs and wonders including healing the sick and caring for souls. The Apostles touched many hearts by their good works and deeds. No wonder that the outside world held them in high regard and the number of the Christian community increased rapidly.

We are called to bear witness to God's boundless mercy and endless love in our lives. Our mission is to be people of love, justice, peace, and charity. This is what our departed Holy Father, Pope Francis lived out. He spread the fragrance of God's goodness in the world by staying in solidarity with the poor and the marginalized in today's society. He brought love, compassion and hope to their lives. As we join the universal church to pray for the repose of the soul of Pope Francis, let us remember to give thanks to God for his humble service and faithful leadership. With the Conclave expected to start in earnest, let us pray that the Cardinal Electors may open their minds and hearts to the guidance of the Holy Spirit to choose a suitable successor to lead the church and inspire us to be a living witness of God's mercy and love in the world.
