## 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Guard Against All Greed

This weekend, we are honored to welcome Most Rev. Anthony Borwah, Bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Gbarnga in Liberia, West Africa. Bishop Anthony will share with us the needs and mission of his diocese. I invite you to be generous in the second collection which will go directly to support the vital work of his mission diocese. Your kindness and support will make a meaningful difference in the lives of our brothers and sisters in Liberia. As I am away this weekend preaching mission appeals for Ghana, I humbly ask for your prayers for a fruitful and successful mission, and for those who will be touched by these efforts. Thank you for your continued generosity and prayerful support. The readings for this Sunday invite us to reorient our hearts, to shift our focus from material wealth to spiritual richness. They challenge us to become rich in what matters to God, rather than in what the world considers valuable. In the first reading, the author of the book of Ecclesiastes offers a sobering meditation on the vanity of human toil. He reminds us that all our labor and achievements, no matter how impressive they may appear, are ultimately meaningless if they are not rooted in God.

The responsorial psalm echoes this truth, comparing life to grass that flourishes in the morning and withers by evening. It calls us to live with wisdom and purpose, making the most of our time by doing good and walking faithfully in the ways of the Lord.

Jesus offers a sobering warning in the Gospel: "Take care to guard against all greed, for one's life does not consist of possession" (Luke 12: 15). He tells the parable of the rich fool, who, after a bountiful harvest, chose to hoard his wealth and place his trust in material comfort. That very night, God demanded his life and all his plans vanished. The man's error was not his success, but his attitude. He was consumed by greed, failed to acknowledge God as the sources of his blessings, and ignored the needs of others. He trusted in the harvest, not in the Lord of the harvest.

In the second reading, Saint Paul exhorts us to seek what is above, not what is on earth. He calls us to put to death greed, boldly naming it as idolatry. Our identity and treasure lie not in what we possess, but in who we are in Christ. We are called to live as renewed people, clothed in His grace and truth. In a world driven by materialism, and self-interest, today's readings offer a timely invitation to reorient our lives. They challenge us to resist the illusions of wealth and place our trust in God. With the psalmist, we pray: "Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain wisdom of heart." May God always be our true treasure.
