

6th Sunday in Ordinary Time Place your trust and hope in God alone

"You can't navigate life without God. Trust God completely with your life and always lean on Him." An elderly priest offered us these words of wisdom years ago at our annual priests' retreat. Those inspiring words have stuck with me. Many of us know how in our Christian life, we struggle to trust God and His purpose for our lives. In most times, our human nature influences us to rely on ourselves or willpower. We feel comfortable trusting in our own human abilities and seek false security in material things. We forget that true happiness is never found in human status or power and material wealth except only in God.

The readings for this Sunday challenge us to trust completely in God and depend on Him in all things. The readings teach us to embrace the values of God's kingdom and generously share our blessings or fortunes with the poor and the marginalized in our midst.

In the first reading, Jeremiah denounced the people of Judah for turning their back on God and depending on human strength and worldly possessions. The people of Judah abandoned God for other false gods.

In a poetic language, Jeremiah drew a sharp contrast between those who trust in themselves or worldly power versus those who rely on God. He compared the ones who rely on human powers or wealth to the dry shrubs in the desert. Jeremiah observed that such persons cannot thrive or survive because they are disconnected to God who is the ultimate source of life. In the case of those who put their trust in God, they are like a fruitful tree planted beside the flowing waters. Those people have no fear of heat because their spiritual roots always stretch to the stream to receive nourishment and flourishment. We each need to discern where we fit in this metaphor? What is our fate? Could we be described as the barren bush or the fruitful tree planted beside streaming waters?

In the gospel, Jesus presented His famous sermon on the mount with focus on beatitudes and curses. He pronounced blessings on the poor in spirit, the downtrodden, the sorrowing, the oppressed and persecuted. He, however, denounced those who put their hope in material things. Jesus taught us a way of living that turns or flips the values of the world upside down. He made it clear that the fortunes of the rich and those who have no room for God in their heart or care about the plight of others will be reversed.

The beatitudes teach us to use worldly goods justly, charitably, and reasonably. They call us to care for the needs of the less fortunate and all those on the fringes of society.

In the second reading, Saint Paul speaks of the resurrection of Jesus as the foundation of our Christian faith. Saint Paul makes a powerful argument that if Jesus has not been raised from the dead then our faith is meaningless, and we are the most pitiable of people. He exhorts all of us to keep the hope of the resurrection alive in our hearts and walk on the path of love that leads to eternal life. We are called to live in ways that are pleasing to the Lord, to show love and compassion for the less fortunate. Let us allow the beatitudes to guide our heart and actions each day by uplifting others. Let us all pray to God for the grace to walk the path that leads to His presence and to find true peace and happiness in Him. God bless.
