## Wisdom of the Saints

# 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Pray with persistence and confidence.

This Sunday's readings highlight the power of persistent prayer and the peace that comes from trusting in God's providence. They reveal a God who listens attentively, responds with compassion, and acts with justice and mercy. In the first reading, Abraham pleaded with God to spare the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah for the sake of the righteous. Abraham's persistence was not met with frustration, but with divine patience and mercy. God listened attentively, revealing a heart open to dialogue and rich in compassion. This sacred encounter teaches us that God welcomes our concerns, our questions, and even our daring petitions, so long as they arise from love and a sincere desire for justice. Yet, while the Lord's mercy is boundless, it does not overlook evil. His compassion is not a license for wrongdoing. Rather, it is a call to righteousness, reminding us that mercy and justice walk hand in hand in the heart of God.

In the Gospel, Jesus responded to the disciples' request, "Lord, teach us how to pray", by giving them the Our Father, a prayer that is both profound and practical. The Our Father models how to approach God with reverence, trust, and humility. Jesus encourages us to be persistent in prayer; to ask, to seek. and to knock with confidence. This persistence is not about convincing God to act but about drawing closer to Him and allowing our hearts to be transformed by His grace. Our heavenly Father knows what we need and delights in giving good gifts to His children.

In the second reading, St. Paul reminds us that through baptism, we have died and risen with Christ. Our sins are forgiven, and we are made new. This new life calls us to live not for ourselves, but as instruments of God's mercy and love in the world. We are to reflect the grace we have received in the way we live each day with compassion, and justice.

As we journey through this week, let us meditate on the Lord's Prayer, not merely as words we recite, but as a spiritual guide that shapes our hearts and directs our actions. May its message inspire us to live with trust, humility, and compassion.

Let us remain steadfast in prayer, even when answers seem delayed, trusting in God's perfect timing and infinite wisdom. May we live as people of mercy. reflecting the love and forgiveness we have received, and letting our lives bear witness to justice and compassion of our heavenly Father. May God continue to watch over us, provide for our needs, and mold our hearts to reflect His divine
