October Honors Our Lady of the Rosary

This year. October 7 is the feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary. The Church chose the first Sunday in October and, apparently by extension, the month of October to honor Our Lady of the Rosary because a great victory took place on October 7, 1571. Pope Pius V called on the Christian princes of Europe to rally to defeat an Islamic threat. The Christian fleet was far outnumbered and appeared to have no human hope of winning. As Christians all over Europe prayed for Our Lady's intercession, almost all of the Turks were driven to shore or drowned. Pope Pius established an annual commemoration to honor Our Lady of Victory, and his successor, Gregory XIII, decreed that the first Sunday in October would be the feast of the Holy Rosary. In summary, the decision to designate October as the month of the Rosary apparently stems from the Church's desire to extend its thanksgiving to Our Lady for victory. ~www.catholicexchange.com

27th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Faith That Endures

This Sunday's liturgy invites us to rekindle the flame of faith within our hearts. The readings challenge us to trust in God even when the path is unclear, to believe even when answers seem distant, and to serve not for recognition, but out of love and devotion.

In the first reading, the prophet Habakuk cried out in anguish: "How long, O Lord, must I call for help?" His lament over injustice and violence echoes the cries of many today, those who suffer and wait silently, and yearn for divine intervention.

Yet, God responded not with immediate relief, but with a vision and a call to patient trust: "The just one, because of his faith, shall live." (Habakkuk 2:4). We, like Habakkuk, are invited to wait with hope, trusting that God's plan will unfold in His perfect time.

The responsorial psalm echoes this invitation: "If today, you hear His voice, do not harden your hearts." Unlike those in the desert, who witnessed God's mighty works, yet gave in to fear and doubt, we are called to listen, trust, and respond not with fear, but with open hearts.

In the Gospel, Jesus reminds us that even a small seed of faith can do great things when rooted in love and service. When the disciples asked Him to increase their faith, He responded by calling them to humble obedience. We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obligated to do. This is the essence of Christian discipleship; faith that expresses itself in quiet acts of love, forgiveness, and service, without counting the cost.

Saint Paul, in the second reading, urged Timothy to rekindle the gift of faith and live with courage. We too, are called to stand firm, serve humbly, and trust in the power of God working within us.

As we journey through October, the month of the Holy Rosary, let us walk with our Mother Mary in prayer and contemplation. Her unwavering faith and guiet strength inspire our own. May each mystery of the Rosary draw us deeper into the heart of Christ, helping us to see with His eyes, love with His hands, and serve with His hands.

Let us cherish the gift of faith, serve with joyful trust, and rest in the assurance that the Lord is always at work within us in silence and in waiting. God bless.
