# 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time: The Prayer of the Humble Heart

This Sunday readings invite us to pause and look inward—to examine the posture of our hearts before God and one another. They challenge us to set aside pride and self-righteousness, and instead to walk the path of humility, sincerity, and dependence on divine mercy.

In the first reading, the book of Sirach reminds us that God is just and impartial. He hears the cry of the poor, the orphaned and the widow. Sirach offers a striking image: "The prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds." This is a beautiful assurance that God's Heart is especially attentive to those who approach Him in humility and sincerity.

The responsorial psalm echoes this truth: "The Lord hears the cry of the poor." God is near to the brokenhearted and delivers them from all their distress. His mercy is tender, attentive, and always within reach.

In the second reading, Saint Paul reflects on a life poured out in service to the Gospel. He endured trials not by his own strength, but by relying on God. His perseverance in faith assured him of the crown of righteousness. Saint Paul encourages us to run the race of faith with endurance, trusting in God's sustaining grace.

In the Gospel, Jesus presents a powerful parable, contrasting two men who went up to the temple to pray: a Pharisee and a tax collector. The Pharisee stood confidently, recounting his religious accomplishments and comparing himself to others. The tax collector, however, stood at a distance, unable even to lift his eyes to heaven. He beat his chest and prayed with sincerity: "O God, be merciful to me a sinner."

Jesus tells us that it was the tax collector who went home justified, not because of merit, but because of mercy. His humility opened the door to

This parable invites us to approach not God with pride but with lowliness of heart. It teaches us that when we come before the Lord in humility, we encounter His tender mercy and transforming love. It is not our achievements that justify us, but our openness to grace.

Like St. Paul, we are called to run the race of faith with endurance, not relying on our own strength, but on God's sustaining grace. Let us not be consumed by pride, but instead embrace the spirit of humility, sincerity, and trust in divine mercy. May our prayers, like those of the lowly and contrite, rise through the clouds and reach the heart of God. God bless you all.
