International Food Festival August 25th–Postponed


Due to the lack of interest in participating in the St. Joseph's International Food Festival, we will be-postponing it at this time.

#### St. Ignatius Lovola Feast Day—July 31st

Founder of the Society of Jesus, St. Ignatius Loyola was born in the castle of Loyola at Azpeitia in Guipuzcoa, Spain, in 1491. His father, Don Beltran, was lord of Onaz and Loyola and head of one of the most ancient and noble families of

Spain. Ignatius, christened Inigo, was the youngest of eleven children. He became a page at the court of King Ferdinand V of Aragon, and entered the military under the command of the Duke of Nagara.

In 1521, a cannon ball broke his right shin and tore open his left calf during the battle of Pamplona against France. After being wounded, he was returned to the family castle at Lovola to recuperate. While recovering, he read books about the life of Christ and the lives of saints. He was so inspired by what he had read, that he decided to dedicate his life to Christ. After his recovery, Ignatius mad a pilgrimage to the shrine of Our Lady at Montserrat. For the next two years, he spent time in Manresa, alternating between a pauper's hospice and a cave. It was during this two-year period of prayer and solitude that he began his great book Spiritual Exercises.

Ignatius left Manresa in 1523 an went to the Holy Land. He returned to Spain in 1524 and went to Barcelona to study Latin. In 1526, he entered the University of Alcala. He went to Paris in 1528 and in 1534, at the age of forty-three, received his master of arts degree. While Ignatius was a student in Paris, he became very friendly with six fellow divinity students, one of whom was St. Francis Xavier.

In 1534, Ignatius and his six companions took a vow of chastity and poverty in a chapel on Montmartre. They pledged to preach the Gospel in Palestine and to offer their services directly to Pope Paul III. This is considered to be the founding of the Society of Jesus, or the Jesuits, as they are commonly known.

In 1537, Ignatius and his companions, who now numbered nine, went to Venice and were ordained. As they could not go to the Holy Land, they made a trip to Rome to offer their services directly to Pope Paul III. Thus, the order was officially formed in 1537 and officially recognized by Pope Paul III in a papal bull on September 27, 1540.


Ignatius was chosen the first superior general, and the members of the order made their final vows in 1541. Ignatius spent the rest of his life in Rome, directing the activities of the Society of Jesus. His book, Spiritual Exercises, was published in 1548. He died in Rome on July 31, 1556.
