St. Norbert Feast Day June 6th

St. Norbert was born at Xanten, in the duchy of Cleves, Prussia in 1080. His was a noble family and at first, he led a carefree life as a cleric and court official under Emperor Henry Vi.

One day, Norbert was riding his horse near Wreden and was caught in a thunderstorm. He was thrown from his horse, and, much like St. Paul on the road to Damascus, heard a voice calling him to the holy life. He immediately changed his way of living and was ordained in 1115. He was denounced by the Council of Fritzlar in 1118 and gave away all his wealth to the poor. He then went to Languedoc where Pope Gelasius II gave him permission to preach the word of Christ wherever he felt it was necessary.

Norbert began to preach in France and was joined by Blessed Hugh of Fosses, a devoted companion. In 1121, at Premonstre, with forty companions, he founded the Order of Premonstratensians. In time, he would establish a number of monasteries and convents. He was appointed Bishop of Magdeburg in 1126 by Emperor Lothair II.

Norbert inspired a reform of Church life and directed new missionary efforts among non-Christians. He was a staunch defender of the papacy and became a good friend of St. Bernard. An eloquent preacher and spokesman for the Church, Norbert died on June 6, 1134, in Magdeburg.
