#### St. Romuald

#### Feast Day—June 19th

St. Romuald was born at Ravenna, Italy, in 950 to a noble family. At the age of twenty, he gave up his indulgent style of

life to give himself to God alone. Apparently, his father had killed a relative in a duel over property. He entered the San Apollinare Monastery at Classe and became a monk in order to make up for his father's sins.

Three years later, Romuald left San Apollinare to search of a more disciplined life and became a hermit. Approximately ten years later, Emperor Otto III appointed him abbot of San Apollinare Monastery. His father, Sergius, had also become a monk, and Romuald was instrumental in guiding his father in the spiritual life. It was also at this time, about 990, that he went to Hungary to convert the Magyars, but was forced to return because of illness.

Romauld grew in wisdom and spiritual insight. His life of solitude and prayer attracted many followers. He founded monasteries in Italy-Vallombrosa in 1012 and Camaldoli in 1023. He also found the Camaldolese Order. Romuald died at Valdi Castro on June 19, 1027. reprinted from The Book of Saints, The Regina Press, 2010)


