St. Anthony Claret Feast Day—October 24th

St. Anthony was born at Sallet, Spain, in 1807. A weaver's son, he worked in a textile mill in Barcelona and learned the printing trade. Ordained a priest in 1835, he entered

the Jesuit novitiate at Rome, but returned to Spain in 1837 to devote himself to preaching missions and retreats throughout Catalonia. One of Spain's great preachers, he sometimes preached as many as twelve sermons in one day. A number of young priests joined him in his ministry. The community he founded in 1849 became known as the Claretians.

In 1845, he was appointed Archbishop of Santiago, Cuba, where he succeeded in bringing about reforms in the Church of that country even though his life was threatened. Queen Isabella II of Spain recalled him to be her advisor in 1857, and Anthony began a new phase of his ministry. He resigned his Cuban archbishopric in 1858, became influential in Spanish political life, and worked tirelessly to instruct the people in their faith. Besides his constant preaching he published over 200 books and pamphlets on religious subjects and established the Religious Publishing House, an influential Catholic publishing house, in Barcelona. In the revolution of 1868, Anthony was exiled with Queen Isabella II. He went to France, where he died near Narbonne on October 24, 1870. (Reprinted from Book of Saints, The Regina Press, 2010)
