Catechist Meeting




On Thursday, September 7th at 6:15 pm, there will be a Catechist meeting in the parish hall. Please mark your calendars.

St. Gregory The Great Feast Day—September 3rd

St. Gregory was born in Rome in 540. His family was one of the few patrician families left in Rome after the ravages of the preceding century, and his father,



Gordian, was a wealthy man who owned property in Romeand Sicily. He was educated in Rome and became a public official. In 570, at the age of thirty, Gregory became the prefect of Rome. Though he was an honest and successful public servant and one of the richest men in Rome, he gave up his position of prominence to devote his life to God.

In 575, he converted his home into a monastery under the patronage of St. Andrew and the guidance of monk, Valentius. He became a monk himself and established six more monasteries in Sicily. He was ordained by Pope Pelagius II and appointed papal ambassador to Constantinpole in 579. In 586, he returned to Rome and became abbot of St. Andrew's monastery. After Pople Pelagius died of the plague in 590, Gregory was elected to the papacy, the first monk to be so honored.

Rome and the rest of Italy were being devastated by drought, famine, plague, and the fierce Lombard invaders. "What happiness is there left in the world?" Gregory asked in a sermon. "Everywhere we hear groans; our cities are destroyed, our land is a desert. See how Rome, the mistress of the world, has fallen." In 593, he negotiated a treated with the Lombard king, Agilulf. Through negotiations and alliances with the Lombards, Franks and Visigoths, he strengthened the Church's position in Italy, France and Spain. At the same time, he continued to spread the Gospel to the ends of the earth, sending missionaries to England a nd other parts of Europe.

Gregory conceived of his English mission, according to a story, one day when he saw some young English slaves in the marketplace. "Who are you?" he asked. "We are called Angels," they replied. "Angels of God," the pope answered. In 596, Gregory sent forty monks headed by St. Augustine to bring Christianity to England.

Through the fourteen tumultuous years of his papacy. Gregory suffered from a chronic illness that left him bedridden for long periods of time. Yet, he continued his tireless service to the Church, and in his preaching and writing urged the people of his day to a courageous patience in their trials. He called himself "the servant of the servants of God," a title very pope since has adopted. He died in Rome on March 12, 604. He is one of the four great Latin Doctors of the Church, along with Sts. Augustine, Ambrose and Jerome. (Reprinted from Book of Saints, The Regina Press, 2010)


