St. Raymond of Penafort Feast Day—January 7th

St. Raymond of Penafort was born in Penafort, Catalonia, Spain in 1175. His family was very prominent and was allied to

the kings of Aragon. He was an exceptional student and taught philosophy at the age of twenty in Bacelona.

In 1210, Raymond left Barcelona and went to Bologna to study canon and civil law. He received his doctorate in 1216 and was made archdeacon by Bishop Berengarius of Barcelona in 1219. In 1222, he entered the newly founded Order of St. Dominic, eight months after the death of its founder.

Pope Gregory IX called Raymond to Rome in 1230, and Raymond became his confessor. Pope Gregory IX also commissioned Raymond to collect and codify the papal decrees which had last been done by Gratian in 1150. Raymond completed this task in about three years, and his work became known as the five books of the 'Decretals.' This study became the cornerstone of canon law for nearly 700 years.

Raymond was named Bishop of Tarragona in 1235, but had to resign because of ill health. He returned to Barcelona and was elected third master general of the Order of St. Dominic in 1238. He revised the Dominican code and resigned in 1240 at the age of 65.


Over the course of the next thirty-five years, Raymond worked and prayed for the conversion of the Moors. He died in Barcelona on January 6, 1275. (reprinted from Book of Saints, Regina Press,
