St. Denis and Companions Feast Day—October 9th

According to tradition, St. Denis was born in Italy. About the year 250, he went to France with six companions and became the first Bishop of Paris. Denis was arrested with two

of his companions, Rusticus and Eleutherius, because of the efforts to convert the citizens of Rome to Christianity. They suffered martyrdom in 258 under the persecution of Decius. The Benedictine abbey of Denis was built over their burial site.

Legend says he was put to death at Montmartre, "the Martyr's Mount," in that city and after execution walked with his head under his arm to the present site of the abbey that bears his name. In art he is represented as a bishop holding his head in his hands. He is honored as the patroon of Paris and of France. (reprinted from The Book of Saints, Regina Press, 2010)
