




Our annual Christmas Boutique will be held on Saturday, December 7th.


We are looking for donations of new or slightly used Christmas items. Items can be dropped off on Saturday, November 30th and Sunday, December 1st in the parish hall.

Halloween is a day to reflect on Christ's triumph over sin, death, and Satan; to meditate on our own mortality and duties to God; to shun sin and the devil; to give honor to the saints in heaven; and to pray for the souls of the faithful departed in purgatory. St. Callistus I Feast Day—October 14th

According to tradition, St. Callistus was a Roman slave and a Christian. As a slave, he was put in charge of a bank by Carpophorus, his master. Eventually, the bank failed and he fled from Rome. He was caught and sen-

tenced to the hand mill. In time, Callistus was released by his creditors, but was rearrested and sentenced to labor in the mines of Sardinia. He was later released at the request of Marcia, a friend of the Emperor Commodus. In 199, Callistus was named director of a Christian cemetery in Rome on the Via Appia by Pope Zephyrinus. The cemetery still exists today and bears Callistus' name.

Freed from slavery, Callistus served the Church as deacon and succeeded Zephyrinus as Pope in 217. He upheld the Catholic belief in the Trinity against heretical teachers and the antipope, St. Hippolytus.

His forgiveness of repentant murders and adulterers, and other acts of kindness toward those who had fallen into sin and showed human weakness caused his enemies to call him too lax and lenient. Callistus, however, knew the power of God's mercy and love. Like Jesus, he saw the Church as the Good Samaritan who came to bind up the wounds of the sinful people. He suffered martyrdom in 222 and was buried on the Aurelian Way. (reprinted from The Book of Saints, Regina Press, 2010)


All Souls Day

All Souls Day is also known as "The Commemoration of the Faithful Departed." It is observed this year on Saturday, November 2nd. The faithful on earth can assist these purgatorial souls in attaining heaven through prayer, good works and offering of Mass.

At Mass on All Souls Day, we pray that through Christ's mercy God's departed servants may be granted pardon and peace and be brought to the joy of God's eternal home.

This All Souls Day, we are asking the children to bring in pictures of their departed love ones so they could be displayed around the altar. They are also asking the parishioners to do the same. Pictures can be 8x10 or smaller in frames with names and phone number on the back. The children can start bringing in their pictures early October and we will have our youth children to help display them all. Remind your children that the roots of Halloween are to pray for dead on the Feast of All Souls Day. Encourage them to attend Mass on the Feast of All Souls and All Saints. Please note that most
