40 Days for Life Baby Shower

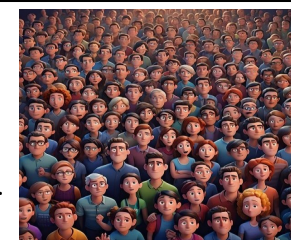
