## St. John of the Cross Feast Day—December 14<sup>th</sup>

St. John of the Cross (1542–1591) is one of the Church's greatest mystics and a Doctor of the Church. Born in Spain, he entered the Carmelite Order as a young man and later worked closely with St. Teresa of Ávila to renew the Carmelites with a spirit of simplicity, prayer, and holiness. This beautiful work of reform brought him many trials, including imprisonment, yet he remained steadfast in faith and charity.

John is best known for his deep spiritual writings—especially The Dark Night of the Soul, The Ascent of Mount Carmel, and The Spiritual Canticle. Through his poetry and teaching, he shows how God gently purifies the heart so it can rest more completely in His love. For John, every challenge becomes an invitation to trust God more fully.

St. John of the Cross reminds us that the path to holiness is often quiet, hidden, and shaped by surrender to God's will. His life is a testimony that even in moments of darkness, God's light is at work within us.


