


Enter into a deeper meaning of what Christ suffered as he prepared to die on the cross.

Below is a little of history of when the Stations of the Cross devotion started.

Born out of widespread devotion to the passion of Christ in the 12th and 13th centuries, the Stations of the Cross, as a devotion, did not begin to develop until the Franciscans were granted custody of Christian sites in Jerusalem in 1342, according to the New Catholic Encyclopedia. St. Leonard of Port Maurice became known as the "Preacher of the Way of the Cross" in the 18th century because he is credited with erecting more than 572 stations between 1731 and 1751.

Holy Week Choir



Saint Joseph Feast Day—March 19th

St. Joseph has two feast days on the liturgical calendar. The first, on March 19, celebrates Joseph as the husband of Mary and the second, on May 1, celebrates St. Joseph the Worker. The Feast of St. Joseph the Worker was instituted by Pope Pius XII in 1955 to recognize the dignity of work.

"The humble craftsman of Nazareth not

only personifies before God and the Holy Church the dignity of the worker of the arm but [he] is also always the provident guardian of you and your families," Pope Pius XII said in a speech delivered in St. Peter's Square on May 1, 1955. Although the Scriptures tell us little about St. Joseph, we know that he worked as a carpenter, a trade that he would have passed on to Jesus.

"Saint Joseph was a carpenter who earned an honest living to provide for his family. From him, Jesus learned the value, the dignity and the joy of what it means to eat bread that is the fruit of one's own labor," wrote Pope Francis in his apostolic letter Patris Corde. "Work is a means of participating in the work of salvation, an opportunity to hasten the coming of the Kingdom, to develop our talents and abilities, and to put them at the service of society and fraternal communion." St. Joseph is the patron of many things, including carpenters, craftsmen, engineers, and workers in general. He is also the patron of the universal Church, fathers, expectant mothers, travelers, homebuyers and sellers, immigrants, and those who are dying.

On March 19th, Italy, especially Sicily, celebrates the Feast of Saint Joseph (San Giuseppe), a day also known as Father's Day in Italy, marked by elaborate feasts, traditions, and the remembrance of a legendary drought relief attributed to the saint.

Special Foods:

Traditional foods include fava bean dishes (like Maccu di San Giuseppe), pastries, and sweets, with figs and zeppole.

Processions and Parades:

Many towns in Sicily organize processions and parades with prayers and songs through the streets, honoring the saint.

St. Joseph's Bread:

Bread is symbolically important, and Saint Joseph's bread is believed to have special powers, with a piece kept in the home to ensure the family will


