St. John I—Pope & Martyr May 18th

St. John was born at Tuscany, Italy and was elected Pope in 523 upon the death of Pope

Hormisidas. King Theodoric the Goth ruled Italy at that time, and he fully supported Arianism. Because of his beliefs, he was in conflict with Byzantine Emperor, Justin, who was a staunch defender of the Catholic faith.

In 523, Justin issued a decree demanding all Arians in his empire to relinquish their churches to the Catholic Church. King Theodoric was greatly angered and sent John to Constantinople to mediate the dispute. Theodoric was also very suspicious of the increasing friendship between the Eastern and Western Churches, for he saw it as a threat to his own rule.

When Pope John I returned to Rome, he found out that Theodoric had murdered his father-in-law, Symmachus, and the great philosopher, Boethius. King Theodoric heard of the burgeoning friendship between John and Emperor Justin and was convinced that a conspiracy was being planned against him. He had John imprisoned at Ravenna, where he died about 526 from the cruel conditions he experienced. (reprinted from The Book of Saints, 2010


