
### Welcome! - Bienvenido! - Mabuhay!

#### PASTOR'S REFLECTION

APRIL 20, 2025,

EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

"They did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead." (John 20:9)

On Easter Sunday the heavy stone sealing the Lord Jesus's tomb was rolled aside, for He had raised His Body back to life after dying for the forgiveness of our sins. If we trust totally in Jesus, He will resurrect our dead bodies also when He returns at the end of time. St. Paul writes, "When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory," (Col 3:4) because "God raised the Lord and will also raise us by his power." (1 Cor 6:14)

So we can trust in the mercy of God, as Peter says: "Everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name." (Acts 10:43) No matter how great and persistent our sins are, God's mercy is greater. That is why this Sunday's psalm says, "Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, for his mercy endures forever."

Next Sunday is the great celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday, the summit of the eight day "octave" celebrating Easter Sunday. Jesus, our Lord and God, offers complete forgiveness of all sins and punishments if we have gone to Confession and receive Holy Communion in a state of grace on Divine Mercy Sunday, on which "all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened." Please join us for an afternoon celebration of Divine Mercy starting at 3:45 p.m. and culminating with 5:00 p.m. Mass and a delicious reception afterward (see detailed program in this bulletin). Let's take advantage of Confession this week if we haven't already, so that we may all be filled with the divine life that comes only from God's mercy.

Why request Mass intentions? The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "From the beginning, the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice [the Mass], so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God" (CCC 1032).

The dead in purgatory can no longer pray for themselves. Pope Francis said that offering Masses for the dead "is the best spiritual help that we can give to their souls, particularly to the most abandoned ones." Masses can also be offered a living person who is sick or suffering; a living person who is celebrating a birthday, anniversary or other special moment in their life; in thanksgiving to God; in thanksgiving for a prayer from a saint; or for a prayer intention (that does not contradict Church teaching). The efficacy or fruitfulness of a Mass in a person's life depends on that person's interior openness to God's will and not merely on the external performance of a sacrament (CCC 2111). We allow normally one intention per Mass, except that two Masses per week may have two intentions.
