
Welcome! - Bienvenido! - Mabuhay!

PASTOR'S REFLECTION APRIL 27, 2025, 2ND SUNDAY OF EASTER: "DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY"

Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." (John 20:19) On the Sunday after Easter, Jesus appeared again to His apostles

On the Sunday after Easter, Jesus appeared again to His apostles and invited Thomas to put his hands into His pierced side which, when on the Cross, was a fountain of Divine Mercy, pouring forth Blood (the Eucharist) and Water (Baptism). This Sunday, the summit of the octave (eight days) of Easter Sunday, is thus called "Divine Mercy Sunday," when the divine floodgates of God's grace pour forth without limit onto the world, from Christ's Most Sacred Heart. His merciful love is like the two rays in the image of Divine

Mercy, offering forgiveness and healing to us poor sinners.

Jesus said to St. Faustina "The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion [on Divine Mercy Sunday] shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and

punishment." Normally a person go to Confession sometime before Divine Mercy Sunday and then receive Holy Communion at one of the Masses for that Sunday. Father Ignacy Rozycki, a Vatican theological expert, stated, "This extraordinary grace is a promise for all souls that the generosity of Jesus is really without limit on this day.... a motivation for them to ask, with great and limitless trust, for all the graces that the Lord wants to lavish on this Sunday."

Please join our Divine Mercy celebration at our Cathedral this Sunday at 3:45 p.m. with Confessions, Adoration, music, Scriptural reflection, then 5:00 p.m. Mass (you may receive Holy

Communion at Mass twice per day) and a delicious reception afterward (see program in this bulletin; free parking will be available in the lot next to the Cathedral and in the parking garage on Philip street, off Madison Ave). On this day, "all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened."

God will give us the extraordinary grace also to be merciful toward others, to be holy as God is holy (1 Peter 1:15).

Why request Mass intentions? The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "From the beginning, the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice [the Mass], so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God" (CCC 1032).

The dead in purgatory can no longer pray for themselves. Pope Francis said that offering Masses for the dead "is the best spiritual help that we can give to their souls, particularly to the most abandoned ones." Masses can also be offered a living person who is sick or suffering; a living person who is celebrating a birthday, anniversary or other special moment in their life; in thanksgiving to God; in thanksgiving for a prayer from a saint; or for a prayer intention (that does not contradict Church teaching). The efficacy or fruitfulness of a Mass in a person's life depends on that person's interior openness to God's will and not merely on the external performance of a sacrament (CCC 2111). We allow normally one intention per Mass, except that two Masses per week may have two intentions.


