Consecration to Mary: Weekly Retreat

The retreat begins Labor Day, Monday September 1, and continues until Monday October 6, with the Mass of Consecration on October 7. Our retreat book is entitled *Total Consecration through the Mysteries of the Rosary* by Fr. Ed Broom. The six meetings will be held at the Parish of Mater Christi (40 Hopewell St., Albany), 6:30-8:00 pm. All are cordially invited! (You do not have to attend the meetings to make your consecration).

The book will be available for purchase (\$15) on September 1 at the meeting, and then at the Cathedral office (125 Eagle Street, Albany) September 2-5, 9:00 am - 4:30 pm. Please sign up in advance so that we can estimate the required number of books. Books purchased at the rectory may be paid for by check or cash. The reading begins on September 1, pp. 3 - 53, the Introduction and the Joyful Mysteries. We will share our reflections and meditations on those mysteries in a small group setting on the following Monday, September 8. PASTORAL REFLECTION August 10, 2025

"Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough." (Luke 13:24)

Ancient cities had fortified walls with gates regulating access. Main gates allowed large caravans of people and animals. The smaller gates were narrower for pedestrians without the encumbrance of many things.


This is like the spiritual life. Jesus says we can only enter eternal life through the "narrow gate," which is His Cross, which doesn't have room for extra baggage like obsessing over wealth, or idolizing luxury and human praise. Rather, God the Father has created us for loving Him with all our heart, all our soul, all our mind, and all our strength, and to love our neighbor as ourselves: "Do this, and you will live." (Luke 10:28)

We can ask the Lord to help us love Him like the words from the Old Testament Song of Songs: "Set me as a seal upon your heart...For Love is strong as Death...Deep waters cannot quench love, nor rivers sweep it away. Were one to offer all the wealth of his house for love, he would be utterly despised." (8:6-7)

"I saw two roads. One was broad, covered with sand and flowers, full of joy, music and all sorts of pleasures. People were walking along it, dancing and enjoying themselves. They reached the end without realizing it. And at the end of the road there was a horrible precipice; that is, the abyss of hell. The souls fell blindly into it; as they walked, so they fell. And their number was so great that it was impossible to count them. And I saw the other road, or rather, a path, for it was narrow and strewn with thorns and rocks; and the people



who walked along it had tears in their eyes, and all kinds of suffering befell them. Some fell down upon the rocks, but stood up immediately and went on. At the end of the road there was a magnificent garden filled with all sorts of happiness and all these souls entered there. At the very first instant they forgot all their sufferings." (St. Faustina, Diary, n. 153).

Eucharistic Miracles Exhibit!



We are excited to host the International Exhibition of the Eucharistic Miracles of the World as designed by Blessed (soon to be Saint) Carlo Acutis September 5-7 at each of our four churches (Cathedral, St. Mary's, and St. Francis's two locations). Eucharistic Miracles are extraordinary events or phenomena which manifest the

Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. For example, a consecrated Host may become human heart tissue, a person may be miraculously healed after receiving Jesus in Holy Communion, the power of Christ in the consecrated Host may stop a flood or fire, or in a saint may live solely on the Eucharist for years. Blessed Carlo photographed many of these miracles and designed this exhibit to spread devotion and faith in Jesus in the Most Holy and Blessed Sacrament. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd!

The Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception will be offering The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) method of faith formation for the 2025-26 year for children from ages 3 to 9. God is deeply present to very young children, and they are capable of developing



both a conscious and intimate relationship with God. A specially prepared environment, the "atrium," is filled with materials of people, places, and things from Scripture and Liturgy which nurture this relationship between the child and God. The program is organized into three levels: ages 3-6, 6-9, and 9-12. Presentations are designed to draw the child into Biblical and Liturgical themes, whose materials are then available to the children to further absorb the lessons. The Cathedral will offer a Level I Atrium for children ages 3-6 on Fridays from 4:00-5:30 pm and a Level II Atrium for children ages 6-9 on Fridays from 6:00-7:30 pm.
