

The Christmas Crèche

The Christmas crèche tradition originated with St. Francis, who staged the first nativity scene on Christmas Eve in 1223 while visiting the Italian village of Greccio.

St. Francis had received permission from Pope Honorious III to hold Midnight Mass in a cave near Greccio's town square. "I want to do something that will recall the memory of that child who was born in Bethlehem, to see with bodily eyes the inconveniences of his infancy, how he lay in the manger, and how the ox and ass stood by," St. Francis reportedly said.

St. Francis gathered a cast of live animals for the scene. He proclaimed the Gospel to the people of Greccio and then preached to them about Jesus' humility and poverty. Coupled with the nativity scene, St. Francis' preaching greatly moved the congregation, and from then on the idea of staging live nativities spread throughout Italy.

<u>PASTOR'S REFLECTION</u> (DECEMBER 14, THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT)

Jesus said, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them. And blessed is the one who takes no offense at me." (Matthew 11:4-6)

Who would take offense at Jesus? After giving sight to the blind, hearing to the deaf, and life to the dead? And after proclaiming the good news of the healing mercy of God?

There were indeed people who took offense at the Lord even in His hometown of Nazareth. They asked, "Where did this man get such wisdom and mighty deeds?" And they took offense at Him, because of their envy, such that Jesus could not work many mighty deeds there because of their lack of faith. (*Matthew* 13:54-58)

Perhaps some take offense at Christianity because Jesus's disciples believe that God became man and, through Jesus, reveals the deep meaning of marriage, family, and gender. Others are "offended" by the claim that there is any absolute truth. Yet Jesus says, "For this I was born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." (John 18:37)

May we listen for the voice of Truth, even during Eucharistic Adoration, so that we may be ready to receive the same Truth in the flesh at Holy Communion.
