
Welcome! - Bienvenido! - Mabuhay!

HALLOW APP

For current subscribers:

- 1. Open app, find Community tab (bottom of screen), create profile

PASTORAL REFLECTION: REMADE FOR MISSION, PART 2 July 27, 2025

"If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?" (Luke 11:13)

When Jesus's disciple asks Him to teach them how to pray, Jesus begins with the Father: **"Father, hallowed be your name."** Being a disciple of Jesus means being a member of His mystical Body, the Church. So if Jesus is the Son of God the Father, then each one of us, in Jesus, is also a beloved son or daughter of the Father.

That is why our prayer can be powerful, even priestly, in Jesus the great High Priest. Jesus's prayer obtains everything from the Father because Jesus is His beloved Son. And Jesus teaches us, His disciples and mystical Body, to remain in Him and ask the Father for the Holy Spirit.

In last week's bulletin I described our pressing need to discern the mission of each of our parishes, including what we need in order to carry out that mission, and what we need to let go. This communal discernment process requires the Holy Spirit, the Light and Wisdom of God, because we don't have the financial or priestly resources to continue as we are doing. Please read the bulletin insert for this week (and last week's bulletin article), and as Jesus says, ask the Father in heaven to give the Holy Spirit to us, so that we may know what defines our mission and what we need from God to carry it

ASSUMPTION OF MARY CELEBRATIONS!

We will celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on August 15! It is the parish feast day of Historic St. Mary's Church, the oldest church in our Diocese (and the second oldest in New York State, after St. Peter's in Manhattan).

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven, body and soul, is so important to



our Christian faith in the resurrection! Not only did Jesus raise His human body and soul into heaven, but He also raised His mother's body and soul into heaven at the end of her life on earth.

She is an image of the Church, because each one of us is desired by God not only to live forever after death but to be with God with our bodies and souls in heaven. We were made not for this earth but for the Father's House!

That is why the Assumption is a holy day of obligation to praise and thank God for sending His Son to suffer and die for our sins and to rise from the dead to give us hope.

Please plan to attend and celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption Mass at one of the following times: August 15 at Historic St. Mary's at 12:05 p.m. (community ice-cream social after Mass) and the Cathedral at 5:30 p.m. (Bishop Scharfenberger, celebrant, followed by a reception); vigil Mass at St. Francis of Assisi Parish on Delaware Ave. on August 14 at 5:30 p.m.

Join us for Adoration and the rosary before the 5:30 Mass at the Cathedral. At these Masses, we will also offer the opportunity to make or renew your consecration to Jesus through Mary, using the prayer composed by St. Louis Marie de Montfort.

That Sunday, we will also have a special parish celebration for Historic St. Mary's between the 8:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Masses—save the date!
