I AM THE LIVING BREAD WHICH CAME DOWN FROM HEAVEN JN 6:51



Did you know our Cathedral is home to a spectacular monstrance nearly five feet tall? This striking receptacle is designed to hold the consecrated Eucharistic Host, the Body of Christ, for adoration and veneration of Our Lord outside of the Mass and outside of the tabernacle.

Restoring this remarkable heirloom for its intended purpose will require significant repairs. It will need to have a luna installed which will hold Our Lord's Body for public adoration and veneration. Given the remarkable size of our monstrance, we will need to have a suitable post fashioned so

that Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament may be conducted, and Our Lord may be carried in Eucharistic Procession. The monstrance will also need to be adorned with a cross, to show the relationship of the Eucharistic Mystery

to Our Lord's Passion.

PASTOR'S REFLECTION MAY 4, 2025

Jesus said to Peter the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" ... Peter said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep." (John 21:17)

Jesus asks Peter three times, "Do you love Me?" because three times Peter publicly denied following Jesus and even knowing Him.



Each denial deeply wounded not only Jesus but also Peter, who wept bitterly after Jesus looked sadly at him after his denials (*Luke* 22:62). Yet Peter's bitter tears signaled the beginning of a new and repentant love for Jesus.

Thanks be to God that the human race has one person who perfectly loves Jesus as He deserves: His Mother, the Immaculate Virgin Mary is the masterpiece of His Mercy, entirely aflame with God's Love, the Holy Spirit, which she desires to share with us. In fact, entrusting ourselves totally to Mary is the quickest, easiest, surest, and most perfect way to belong to Christ and become a saint. Just as Jesus came to us through her and subjected himself to his mother for 30 of His 33 years on earth (*Luke* 2:51), we follow Jesus's example by going to Him through her and placing ourselves totally under her care.

The Eucharistic Revival and the 2025 Jubilee Year will be maximally fruitful for us if we ask our Blessed Mother to dispose us and open us to the Holy Spirit. Please join me in a 33-day preparation (starting Memorial Day, May 26) to consecrate ourselves to the Sacred Heart of Jesus through the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The consecration will take place at a Saturday morning Mass at the Cathedral on June 28, the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Please look out for more information online and in our bulletin, including signup forms in the next two weeks. We will also offer weekly Monday meetings starting May 26 using the book 33 Days to Morning Glory by Fr. Michael Gaitley (which you can order online), but you can use another approach if you like. You can also use the app "Hallow" and search "33 Days" and find the audio series "33 Days to Morning Glory" or "33-Day Marian Consecration," both read by Sr. Marian James.

The Lord is risen! He calls us to follow Him! And the one who leads us to follow Him is His Immaculate Virgin Mother in Heaven.

Why request Mass intentions? The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "From the beginning, the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them,

above all the Eucharistic sacrifice [the Mass], so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God" (CCC 1032).

The dead in purgatory can no longer pray for themselves. Pope Francis said that offering Masses for the dead "is the best spiritual help that we can give to their souls, particularly to the most abandoned ones." Masses can also be offered a living person who is sick or suffering; a living person who is celebrating a birthday, anniversary or other special moment in their life; in thanksgiving to God; in thanksgiving for a prayer from a saint; or for a prayer intention (that does not contradict Church teaching). The efficacy or fruitfulness of a Mass in a person's life depends on that person's interior openness to God's will and not merely on the external performance of a sacrament (CCC 2111). We allow normally one intention per Mass, except that two Masses per week may have two intentions.
