


Consecration to Mary Retreat

PASTORAL REFLECTION October 12, 2025

One of the lepers, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him...Jesus said in reply, "Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?" Then he said to him, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you." (Luke 17:15-19)

Although Jesus is God, His human heart desires love and gratitude like we all do. But His Sacred Heart does not become hardened by people's ingratitude but is instead all the more pained, because the Father has sent His beloved only-begotten Son with Divine Mercy for sinners. "God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8)

Saint Faustina writes in her diary (paragraph 384), "Each time I thought of God's great mercy and of the ingratitude of souls, pain stabbed at my heart, and I understood how painfully it wounded the sweetest Heart of Jesus." Jesus is the eternal God who feels with a human Heart. He desires to forgive, heal, and restore us to communion with the Father, inflaming us with the love of the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit continues to work through His spouse, the Blessed Virgin Mary. In Fatima she appeared on October 13, saying she was Our Lady of the Rosary and asking us to pray the rosary every day, and she ended with, "Do not offend the Lord our God anymore, because He is already so greatly offended." In today's society we often are "offended" by things of varying importance—why

not first focus on how, through our ingratitude, we might be offending the infinite generosity, mercy, and holiness of God, and pray the rosary daily so that the world might be saved by the death and resurrection of His only begotten Son?
