PASTORAL REFLECTION September 14, 2025

"Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life... For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:14-17)

Do you make the sign of the Cross "fast" or "slow"? Our natural tendency in public may be to make the sign of the Cross faster and smaller! But God is not ashamed of the Cross; He did not recoil from being crucified for six hours. He was lifted up on the Cross, as Moses lifted up the bronze serpent on the pole, and whoever looked with faith upon the serpent was healed.

Christ compares His Crucifixion on the Cross with the bronze serpent mounted on a pole—a strange link between Jesus the Savior, and the serpent, symbol of death! But St. Paul wrote "[For our sake, God] made him who did not know sin to be sin." (2 Corinthians 5:21). Pope St. John Paul II explains that the prophet Isaiah says, "We had all gone astray like sheep...but the Lord laid upon him the guilt of us all" (Is 53:6) and that although Christ, the Holy One, was absolutely sinless, he agreed to take our sins upon himself to redeem us.

So Christians, even from the earliest days of the Church, made the sign of the Cross, blessed themselves with the Sign of the Cross. When people look at us funny if we make the sign of the cross in public—that's a sharing in the humiliation of the Cross of Christ. But there are benefits to this. St. Cyril said, "Let us, therefore, not be ashamed of the Cross of Christ; but though another hide it...openly seal it upon thy forehead, that the devils may behold the royal sign and flee trembling far away. Make then this sign at eating and drinking, at sitting, at lying down, at rising up, at speaking, at walking: in a word, at every act." And St. John Mary Vianney said, "Before

beginning your work... never fail to make the Sign of the Cross.... Offer quite simply all your difficulties to God and renew this offering from time to time, [and then] you will have the happiness of drawing down the blessing of Heaven on yourself and on all you do."

Through the Cross, we are saved. Through the Cross, we become like Christ. Through embracing our crosses, we become saints by God's sanctifying grace, and nothing else matters more than that.
