Saint of the Day for July 13th

St. Henry

(May 6, 972-July 13, 1024)



As German king and Holy Roman Emperor, Henry was a practical man of affairs. He was energetic in consolidating his rule. He crushed rebellions and feuds. On all sides he had to deal with drawn-out disputes so as to protect his frontiers. This involved him in a number of battles, especially in the south in Italy; he also helped Pope Benedict VIII quell disturbances in Rome. Always his ultimate purpose was to establish a stable peace in Europe.

According to eleventh-century custom, Henry took advantage of his position and appointed as bishops men loyal to him. In his case, however, he avoided the pitfalls of this practice and actually fostered the reform of ecclesiastical and monastic life. He was canonized in 1146.

Reflection: All in all, this saint was a man of his times. From our standpoint, he may have been too quick to do battle and too ready to use power to accomplish reforms. But granted such limitations, he shows that holiness is possible in a busy secular life. It is in doing our job that we become saints.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As the Roman Catholic Diocese of Albany progresses with the "Remade for Mission" initiative, the first step includes assessment and information sharing so parishioners can understand their parish's current state of affairs. The self-reflection and information sharing process is not based on one area but is wholistic and covers a broad-spectrum including parish finances, liturgical attendance, sacramental life, volunteer participation and involvement, serving the needs of the people in the greater community, and the many components required in fulfilling our mission to the best of our ability.

Over many years we have become inwardly focused and living in a state of decline. We must honestly and critically assess, identify, and share this information with our parishes so they have time to contemplate and journey from an emotional state of mind to a rational state of mind. Many parishes have already commenced this assessment phase and will continue to do so in the weeks and months ahead. However, there are some parishes where the people are not aware their parish is struggling to survive. All parishes will follow the "Remade for Mission" timeline of discernment and implementation, but parish networks that are already journeying through the assessment and information sharing phase and are ready to take action will have the flexibility to submit their recommendations to Bishop ahead of the April deadline.

"Remade for Mission" is a difficult, but necessary process for our Church to refocus on why we exist and do so to the best of our ability while being responsible stewards of our limited resources. Let us unite as brothers and sisters in Christ and foster strong and vibrant communities. Remember, we are called to love one another and go out to serve the needs of all who reside within the geographical region known as the Diocese of Albany.

More information will be shared about Remade for Mission as the process unfolds. This will require much prayer, and we call upon the Holy Spirit to provide the wisdom and courage needed to best fulfill our mission.
