

UPDATE: SAINT JAMES/ALB CAP FUND DEBT

Two weeks ago, we submitted a letter to Father Bob Longobucco, Trustee of the Diocesan Investment and Loan Trust (DILT), on behalf of Father David and Saint Francis of Assisi Parish, proposing a plan to fully eliminate the St. James/Alb Cap Fund Debt owed to the DILT. Our plan was to apply \$44,104.75 from the recent sale of Saint James school, representing 50% of the \$88,209.49 balance, and a request that the Trust consider matching the remaining 50%.

The Board of the Diocesan and Investment and Loan Trust met last week to consider our proposal, and we are pleased to announce they approved our repayment plan and authorized a \$44,104.74 match! This will completely retire the St. James/Alb Cap Fund Debt!

Congratulations, and thank you for your commitment and diligent efforts to repay the loan. The Board also recognizes and appreciates those efforts and the good work being done in the parish.

The Publication of Mass Intentions, an explanation

A number of people have inquired why the mass intentions are no longer printed in the bulletin. The answer is two-fold theological and practical.

Theologically, every Eucharist is offered for all of the dead and all of the living. Thus there really is no need for stipended/announced Masses. Each person who attends the Eucharist prays and offers their own intentions to God throughout the Eucharist. The practice of paying a priest to pray for a person's intention came about when people were not able to attend the Eucharist for whatever reason. It is a personal contract between the person and the priest and only by custom came to be made public.

On a practical level, all intentions for the dead on a given weekend are listed in the Universal Prayers at **all** Masses not just the specific time requested. So it doesn't make a difference which Eucharist you attend; all names are proclaimed. Also with the bulletin now being shared by two parishes and a Spanish section, room in the bulletin is limited.


In other words your prayers are just as efficacious at every Mass as the that of the priest...Fr. David
