
Welcome! - Bienvenido! - Mabuhay!

ASSUMPTION OF MARY CELEBRATIONS!

We will celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on August 15! The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven, body and soul, flows from our faith in the Resurrection! She is an image of the Church's members, whom God desires to be with Him physically in heaven in the Father's House. So this is a *holy*



day of obligation to praise and thank God. Please plan to celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption at one of the following Masses:

- 8/14 vigil Mass (Spanish-English bilingual),
 5:30 p.m., St. Francis of Assisi Parish on Delaware Ave. (Bishop Scharfenberger, celebrant);
- 8/15 at Historic St. Mary's at 12:05 p.m. (community ice-cream social after Mass) and
- **8/15 at the Cathedral at 5:30 p.m.** (followed by a reception); Join us for Adoration and the rosary before the 5:30 Mass at the Cathedral.

At these Masses, we will also offer the opportunity to make or renew your consecration to Jesus through Mary, using the prayer composed by St. Louis Marie de Montfort.

It also is the *parish feast day of Historic St.*Mary's Church, the oldest church in our Diocese (the second oldest in New York State, after St. Peter's in Manhattan). That Sunday 8/17, we will have a special parish celebration for Historic St. Mary's between the 8:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Masses, including saying farewell to our St. Mary's Parish Administrator Matt Castiglione.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd!

The Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception will be offering The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) method of faith formation for the 2025-26 year for children from ages 3 to 9.

The philosophy of CGS is that even very young children have a religious life. God is present to them in their deepest

being, and they are capable of developing both a conscious and intimate relationship with God. A specially prepared environment known as the "atrium" is filled with materials of people, places, and things from Scripture and Liturgy which nurture this relationship between the child and God. The program is broken into three levels corresponding to the different planes of the child's development: ages 3-6, 6-9, and 9-12. Presentations with specific materials are designed to draw the child into Biblical and Liturgical themes, which are then available to the children during their work time so they may further absorb the lessons.

The Cathedral will offer a Level I Atrium for children ages 3-6 on Fridays from 4:00-5:30 pm and a Level II Atrium for children ages 6-9 on Fridays from 6:00-7:30 pm. Both sessions will begin September 26. For more information, email Jody Agnew at agnewi@apcsd.org. PASTORAL REFLECTION August 10, 2025

Jesus said, "Do not be afraid...Sell your belongings and give alms. Provide money bags for yourselves that do not wear out, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven that no thief can

reach nor moth destroy. For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." (Luke 12:32-34)

Where are we storing up treasure? In our possessions, or in our works of mercy? Jesus teaches us that the only treasure that lasts forever in heaven is our love for God and for other people, a concrete love that is always a gift of ourselves.



The Eucharist is Jesus's spiritual and physical total gift of Himself to all who are open to receiving him completely. In the Last Supper and the Crucifixion and the Mass, which are all one cosmic supernatural event, Jesus "loved His own in the world and He loved them to the end." (John 13:1) St. Therese says that when Jesus gives Himself in Holy Communion, He desires that the soul welcomes Him with love: "It is not to occupy a golden ciborium that Jesus every day comes down from heaven, but it is to find another heaven, namely our soul, in which He takes delight."

Let's make our souls another heaven for Jesus, especially by giving alms to the poor. Mother St. Teresa of Kolkata said, "Whenever I meet someone in need, it's really Jesus in his most distressing disguise." Everyone has something to offer, and as Jesus says in the Gospel today, "Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more."

Eucharistic Miracles Exhibit!

We are excited to host the International Exhibition of the Eucharistic Miracles of the World as designed by Blessed (soon to be Saint) Carlo Acutis **September 5-7** at each of our four churches (Cathedral, St. Mary's, and St. Francis's two locations). Eucharistic Miracles are extraordinary events or phenomena which manifest the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. For example, a consecrated Host may become human heart tissue, a person may be miraculously healed after receiving Jesus in Holy Communion, the power of Christ in the consecrated Host may stop a flood or fire, or in a saint may live solely on the Eucharist for years. Blessed Carlo photographed many of these miracles and designed this exhibit to spread devotion and faith in Jesus in the Most Holy and Blessed Sacrament. Come and witness the love that Jesus has for you. We will have interests for all ages, including coloring pages for children, copies of the comic book The Digital Disciple, and more.
