HALLOW APP

For current subscribers:

1. Open app, find Community tab (bottom of screen), create profile 2. Search for parish (zip code is fastest), join parish

For people completely new to Hallow:

- 1. Scan QR code (hallow.com/parish)

OCIA: You can help adults on the journey to become Christian, enter full communion with the Catholic Church, or complete the Sacraments of First Communion or Confirmation. PASTORAL REFLECTION July 6, 2025

"The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." (Luke 10:2)

The Lord Jesus sends out his disciples with the Gospel ("good news") of God's mercy for sinners. God "plants the seed" of this good news in the souls of sinners who hear it. Jesus desires that more "laborers" (clergy and laypeople) are sent out to sow the seeds of the Gospel, cultivate it through love of God and love of neighbor, and "reap the harvest" when sinners accept Divine Mercy. Pope Francis often explains the difference between a "sinner" (who seeks God's forgiveness) and a "corrupt" person (who doesn't seek God's forgiveness). If we recognize ourselves as sinners and open ourselves to God's divine grace, the Lord will enter and make us holy, which means doing God's will. God calls each of us to holiness, as God says, "Be holy, for I, the Lord your God, am holy." (Leviticus 19:2, 1 Peter 1:16)

As we strive to grow in holiness, we must be patient with ourselves and not get discouraged. God is patient and merciful, as long as we keep trying to do His will and keep trusting in Jesus. The more that we trust in Jesus, the more grace we will receive to make abundant his harvest of holy souls.
