PASTORAL REFLECTION July 13, 2025

Jesus asked, "Which of these three...was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" He answered, "The one who treated him with mercy." Jesus said, "Go and do likewise." (Luke 10:36-37)

In Jesus's parable a traveler is robbed, stripped of his clothes, and left to die. A priest and a scholar pass by, but only a Samaritan stops and cares for the man. The "Good Samaritan" brings the nearly dead man to an inn to be cared for.

Saint Augustine sees the Samaritan as Christ who saves and restores us to life. The traveler represents Adam (and all people), who is attacked by Satan and demons (robbers), is stripped of immortality, and left spiritually dead from sin. Jesus comes as the Good Samaritan who unexpectedly rescues man from death and brings him to the inn of the Church, which refreshes and heals humanity through the Sacraments.

This restoration and "divinization" of humanity (2 Peter 1:4) radiates through the lives of the saints like St. Kateri Tekakwitha, a great Adorer of the Eucharist and whose feast day is this Monday, July 14. Born in Auriesville (whose Martyrs' Shrine is a 2025 Jubilee Year site in our diocese), she is an image of steadfast pure love among her people who largely rejected Christ. Yet she did penance for them, a stirring inspiration to us that Jesus Christ offers us the grace to be forgiving and even solicitous for those who hate us because we love and follow the Lord.
