PASTORAL REFLECTION July 20, 2025

Jesus said, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many

Jesus said, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her." (Luke 10:41-42) Jesus gently points out that Martha has lost her peace by worrying about many things. Her sister Mary, however, has chosen "the better part," to sit at the feet of Jesus and listen to Him. Work is necessary, but listening first to Jesus guides our work and makes it fruitful.

This applies especially to Bishop Scharfenberger's recent letters about being "Remade for Mission," exhorting us to listen to Jesus and discern what specifically God's mission is for each parish, and what we need to carry it out. At one level Jesus says, "Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Matthew 25:31-46) and "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them...teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:19)

But how do His words apply to serving people within our parish boundaries, even outside of church? Bishop Ed consistently asks, "Who is here?" Who lives or works here, and why should our parish have a physical presence unless we are serving locals spiritually or corporally?" Moreover, as Bishop Ed quipped in his June 25 column, "Dead flowers [around the altar] do not give glory to God... Neither do half-empty churches!"

Therefore, our parish network (including St. Francis of Assisi, Historic St. Mary's, and the Cathedral) and all parishes of our Diocese will begin a synodal process (listening, discussion, action) during the next 12 months. (Read more at www.rcda.org/remadeformission.) However, because of unsustainable operating deficits within our parish network, we also must take some significant initial actions to "stop the bleeding." We three parishes are in this together in the Body of Christ, the Church, and when one part suffers, the whole Body suffers: "God has so constructed the body...so that there may be no division in the body, but that the parts may have the same concern for one another." (1 Corinthians 12:24-26)

without prayer, people follow themselves, not God), so in August I will renew meetings with our finance councils and restart the convening of an inter-parish Pastoral Council with the facilitating assistance of Deacon Tim Kosto. If you know someone (even yourself) who is willing to pray and work for the common good of our parish network, please email me or Deacon Tim at the email addresses in the bulletin, or call our parish office. But again, please pray (and I highly recommend the illuminating grace of Confession) before "doing" anything, because it ultimately is all about discerning the will of Jesus, for ultimately it is His mission, and we are His Body, the Church.
