
# Welcome! - Bienvenido! - Mabuhay!

#### HALLOW APP

#### For current subscribers:

- 1. Open app, find Community tab (bottom of screen), create profile
- 2. Search for parish (zip code is fastest), join parish

#### For people completely new to Hallow:

- 1. Scan QR code (hallow.com/parish)
- 2. Find parish (zip code is fastest), set up profile

#### PASTORAL REFLECTION June 1, 2025—Seventh Sunday of Easter

Jesus prayed saying: "Holy Father, I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent

Jesus prays to His Father in heaven "that they may all be one." How much the Lord Jesus desires that we be united in loving God and loving each other. Only by loving each other in a truly Christian way will the world believe that we are Christians, and that Jesus is truly God, Who offers us the power and grace to love as Jesus loves, laying down His life for us so that, if we trust in Him completely, we may live with Him forever beyond death.

Our new Holy Father, Pope Leo XVI, desires that the Catholic Church to be "a sign of unity and communion"; his papal motto is In illo Uno unum — "In the one Christ we are one." He echoes St. John Paul II who wrote about Jesus's desire "that they may all be one," that all Christians might be one. Although there are many things that unite Catholic and non-Catholic Christians in our faith and morals, there are still some significant things that prevent all Christians from being fully united in faith, worship, and life.

Christians can be a convincing witness for the world and bring people to God only if we are united in the Truth which is the person of Jesus. Saint Paul VI said, "Evangelization is bound up with the witness of unity given... The division among Christians is a serious reality which impedes the very work of Christ." But if we are united, through God's grace, this unity will not only help the world to believe but ultimately give glory to God, as St. John Paul II wrote: "The phrase 'that the world may believe' has been so strongly emphasized that at times we run the risk of forgetting that, in the mind of the Evangelist, unity is above all for the glory of the Father."

## Thank you for your help



Why request Mass intentions? The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "From the beginning, the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice [the Mass], so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God" (CCC 1032).

The dead in purgatory can no longer pray for themselves. Pope Francis said that offering Masses for the dead "is the best spiritual help that we can give to their souls, particularly to the most abandoned ones." Masses can also be offered a living person who is sick or suffering; a living person who is celebrating a birthday, anniversary or other special moment in their life; in thanksgiving to God; in thanksgiving for a prayer from a saint; or for a prayer intention (that does not contradict Church teaching). The efficacy or fruitfulness of a Mass in a person's life depends on that person's interior openness to God's will and not merely on the external performance of a sacrament (CCC 2111). We allow normally one intention per Mass, except that two Masses per week may have two intentions.
