
Welcome! - Bienvenido! - Mabuhay!


HALLOW APP

PASTORAL REFLECTION June 22, 2025 The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

"Taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, Jesus said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. They all ate and were satisfied." (Luke 11:16-17)

In every Holy Mass, the Lord Jesus feeds multitudes with spiritual food, his living Body and Blood in what appears to be mere bread and wine. Especially on this Sunday Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ ("Corpus Christi" in Latin), we proclaim our faith in his living Presence in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Jesus, who is God, says, "This is my Body... This cup is the new covenant in my Blood." (1 Corinthians 11:24-25)

How fitting it is to adore Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament especially this Sunday! We will have a Eucharistic procession after the 8:00 a.m. Mass at Historic St. Mary's and walk with Him to the Cathedral, to bring the Lord beyond the walls of our churches, "so that he may walk where we walk and live where we live...The procession represents an immense and public blessing for our city." (Pope Benedict XVI) At the Cathedral we will adore the Lord all day, before and after the 11:00 a.m. Mass, and continuing until the 5:00 p.m. Mass. At St. Francis on Delaware Ave. and Historic St. Mary's, we will also have a Holy Hour of Adoration before the Saturday 4:00 p.m. Masses.

On this coming Thursday evening, we will also begin a 40 Hours Devotion of Adoration in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and Immaculate Heart of Mary, where we will need

Adorers during those 40 hours, especially overnight. There will be 5:15 p.m. Masses on Thursday and Friday for the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and 9:00 a.m. Mass on Saturday for the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Please spread the word and pray for these devotions and Eucharistic worship to give glory to God and to save and sanctify our souls.

The greater our faith, trust, and belief in Jesus's Real Presence in the Eucharist, the more we will see miracles of healing, conversion, and peace. Let's pray that more people come and benefit from the peace of being with Jesus in Adoration. He desires our presence, that we may deepen our friendship with God

40 Hours Adoration of the Sacred Heart





BECOME HOLY BY CONSECRATION TO MARY!

Are you ready to learn the quickest, surest, easiest, and most perfect way to holiness? St. Louis de Montfort knew that the quickest way to be transformed into a saint is through a relationship with Our Immaculate Virgin Mother, Mary, as Mother of the Incarnate Word and Spouse of the Holy Spirit. Join us on Monday, July 7, as we begin a six-week retreat for Marian Consecration according to St. Louis de Montfort. Each week will present a stepping stone to Mary. First, we will learn to renounce the world to be filled with the



spirit of Jesus Christ. Then will explore our knowledge of our self, Mary, and Jesus Christ before making the act of consecration and going on to live out our consecration. The consecration Mass will be on the Solemnity of the Assumption on August 15 at Historic St. Mary's at 12:05 p.m. and the Cathedral at 5:15 p.m.


In our weekly meetings, Mondays, 6:30-8:00 pm, at Mater Christi Church, 40 Hopewell St., we'll share our insights within our small group and then watch some 30-minute videos. If you desire to transform your relationship with Christ, improve your relationships or a marriage, this is a perfect way to do it. We will use the book Preparation for Total Consecration to Jesus Christ Through Mary: According to St. Louis De Montfort by Fr. Hugh Gillespie, SMM, which you can order online. (We may also have some copies available for purchase on July 7, if supplies last.) Please look out for flyers and signup sheets in church near the entrances.

You may also follow similar readings the app "Hallow" (search for "33 Days" and the Cathedral network).

Six weekly Monday meetings start on "Day 1," July 7, 6:30-8 pm, at Mater Christi Parish. All are welcome! (You do not have to attend the meetings to make

your consecration.)
