
Welcome! - Bienvenido! - Mabuhay!

HALLOW APP

For current subscribers:

- 1. Open app, find Community tab (bottom of screen), create profile
- 2. Search for parish (zip code is fastest), join parish

For people completely new to Hallow:

- 1. Scan QR code (hallow.com/parish)
- 2. Find parish (zip code is fastest), set up profile
- 3. Follow prompts to \$1 trial (to opt out and be on the free version, hit "skip" when prompted)
- 4. Take note of login credentials (phone # or email address) and be sure to use these same credentials when logging in once the app is downloaded.

To improve the quality of the broadcast our Livestream Ministry is being reformed. Creative camera work and smooth transitions are much more important than technical knowledge. OCIA: You can help adults on the journey to become Christian, enter full communion with the Catholic Church, or complete the Sacraments of First Communion or Confirmation. We will soon be initiating the new Order of Christian Initiation of Adult (formerly RCIA) ministry. We are in need of both catechists and sponsors. <u>Visitation:</u> The homebound and sick cannot attend Mass in person, but you can bring Jesus to them. PASTORAL REFLECTION June 29, 2025

Simon Peter said in reply, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." (Matthew 16:16)

On this Sunday falls the great solemnity of the two major apostles: Saints Peter and Paul. Both said they were great sinners, yet both became great saints and martyrs, witnessing to Jesus in their preaching and shedding their blood for the Lamb of God. We believe that Saint Peter was crucified upside down (because he didn't feel worthy to be crucified exactly like Christ), while St. Paul was beheaded with a sword.

Pope Benedict XVI explained that Sts. Peter and Paul together represent the whole Gospel of Christ. They were very different, but they "illustrate a new way of being brothers...made possible by the grace of Christ's Gospel working within them." Only by following Jesus can we be brothers and sisters with those who are very different and even conflict with us.

I am so grateful to Jesus, our Lord and God, and to the many people who participated in our Corpus Christi procession, Adoration, and 40 Hours of worship of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. He unites us by His grace and mercy, empowering us to forgive and love our enemies. Together we can share the "good news," the Gospel message that God is merciful towards us sinners and desires to make us holy if we allow Him to reign totally in our hearts.

This feast day also reminds us of our connection with the universal Church through our bishop, the successor of the apostles, and our Diocese. June 30 is the last day to contribute to our 2025 Diocesan Appeal, which supports our parishes to give glory to God and save souls in so many ways: canon law expertise on weddings and broken marriages, human resources guidance regarding state laws, property management and leases, and many other areas. Our Diocesan Appeal also supports our seminarians who are in formation to serve as our priests. None of the Appeal goes toward settling our bankruptcy. Please join me in supporting our Diocesan Appeal (https://thediocesanappeal.org/), so that we can continue our important local mission.


