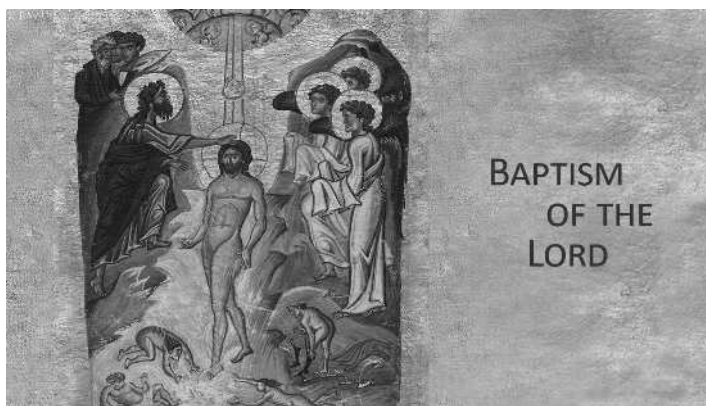

"I need to be baptized by you, and yet you are coming to me?" the Baptist says on seeing Jesus. There are moments when it is important to "allow things to happen."

What seems so abnormal that John the Baptist feels embarrassed is, however, part of God's plan that will "bring to fulfillment" every righteousness, since Jesus – as He Himself would one day declare – did not come to abolish the law and the prophets (Mt. 5:17), but to bring God's justice "to fulfillment".

This justice does not humiliate, does not separate, does not judge. Rather, it unites, breaks down barriers, responds to everyone's needs and respects everyone. God's justice is superior than human justice: He does not use the measuring stick of "how much" – you pay according to the measure that you have offended. Rather, He uses the measuring stick of love, mercy, forgiveness – the only measuring stick that can bridge distances and heal wounded hearts since it is from within that evil intentions are born (Mk. 7:1-23).

PASTOR'S REFLECTION

(JANUARY 11, 2026, THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD)

After Jesus was baptized, he came up from the water and behold, the heavens were opened for him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." (Matthew 3:16-17)

In 2002 Pope St. John Paul II added the Mysteries of Light (or "Luminous" Mysteries) to the Holy Rosary, Jesus Christ's life between the joyful mysteries of His childhood and the sorrowful mysteries of His Passion. The first Mystery of Light is the Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River, which we ponder and honor on this last Sunday of the Christmas season. Meditating on the baptism of Jesus bears in us the spiritual "fruit" of greater openness to the Holy Spirit, Who reveals Christ, the face of the invisible God, our Father.



If we meditate on this mystery, we might ask: Why would Jesus need to be baptized? St. Maximus of Turin explains: "Christ is baptized, not to be made holy by the water, but to make the water holy." Jesus steps into the river of baptism to lead us in the battle against temptation, sin, and evil; and as King of Kings, and Head of the Church, He is completely victorious and sends us the same Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation so that we more deeply remain in Him and share His eternal Kingship and victory.

Baptism and Confirmation allow us to share in the anointing of Jesus with the Holy Spirit and power, "doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him," as Peter says in the second reading from the Acts of the Apostles. But this power is not primarily and initially to condemn but to save souls through the offer of mercy, as Isaiah prophesies in the first reading: "A bruised reed he shall not break, and a smoldering wick he shall not quench." Although God's justice will come definitively at the end of each person's life and the end of time, now is the time for us to respond to His Mercy, through frequent Confession, Communion, and doing the works of mercy for Jesus in others.

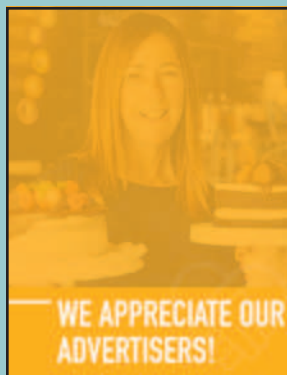
