

(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS By Colleen Jurkiewicz Dorman ~ Remembering Advent It always makes the laugh a little, these apocalyptic Gospel readings that come at the beginning of Advent.

What a funny juxtaposition — all of us stringing twinkle lights and wrapping presents, with Jesus thundering on about the end of the world. It's Christmas! Don't be a downer. Pour me some more eggnog and turn up the Nat King Cole.

Well, except it's not Christmas. It's Advent.

There's nothing wrong with the cultural accessories that have developed alongside this religious holiday. There's nothing wrong with the twinkle lights and the eggnog. But here's the thing: when Satan knows we're watching the front gate, he slips in the back door. And something I've found is that one back door he likes to use in my life is Cultural Christmas.

I love Cultural Christmas. I tend to overdo Cultural Christmas. I overschedule, I overdecorate, I overgift. All this "over" leads to — you guessed it! — overwhelm. "The anxieties of daily life," as Jesus describes in today's Gospel, make my heart drowsy. My *spiritual* Christmas joy, time and time again, is diminished — all because I embrace Cultural Christmas and ignore Advent. Satan sneaks in with the twinkle lights and the Christmas carols and he snatches The Present like the nasty little Grinch he is. He photobombs my experience of the religious holidays with the anxieties I so willingly embrace because of the production that is Cultural Christmas.

So, remember to rest this Advent, folks. Rest your heart. Rest your hands. Watch the back door *and* the front. Remember that this is the perfect time to be thinking about the state of your soul and not just the state of your house.

about them. Our shelves are full of books on different topics. Check out the shelves in the vestibule & on the cart in the hall.


Birthright thanks all parishioners who participated in our Baby Bottle Boomerang fundraiser. Your support enables us to continue assisting pregnant women and families in need of help. We are also making an urgent plea to all parishioners who still have baby bottles. There are still 6 outstanding bottles at SF & 10 at SJ. These bottles are needed for future fundraising efforts. Even if the bottles are empty, please return them to the designated box, bring them to the Birthright office at 1490 Saratoga Road, PO Box 661, Ballston Spa, NY 12020, or mail them to the Birthright office (our address is on the bottom of each bottle). Pastoral Care: If you know of someone who is ill & needs to have communion at home or in hospital, please call the office, so we can have a pastoral minister visit them.

The Diocesan Appeal - which began on July 1 and will run until June 30, 2025 - has the goal of raising \$6.1 million. That money funds 74 percent of the mission and ministry of the Diocese of Albany, with the remaining money coming from legacies and bequests, interest and dividends from investments, bookkeeping and accounting fees, registration and counseling fees. The Diocese must use 100 percent of the money from the Appeal as the donor intended it for, as with all charitable gifts. It cannot be used to pay for Child Victims Act



settlements or to pay legal fees during a bankruptcy process. Money used so far to settle lawsuits has come from the diocesan self-insurance fund. "The annual diocesan budget is set based on expected needs. The allocations for each parish is then based on that budget," said Father David LeFort, Vicar General for the Diocese of Albany. "The funds received in the annual appeal are received based on that budget & allocations. Thus the funds received are restricted to those needs."


