3rd Sunday of Easter

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy Easter, today we hear the iconic passage of the Walk to Emmaus. This scripture passage invites us to reflect on some important questions regarding our spiritual journey. It also invites us to enter the scripture and see ourselves as the two disciples. Jesus speaks to you in the scripture, just as he speaks to the two disciples.

These two disciples, one named Cleopas and the other not named, are leaving Jerusalem after the crucifixion. This action is significant because for the Jewish people following Jesus, Jerusalem is where God is present. They are journeying away from God and it is Jesus who is seeking them. Do we recognize the times when we journey away from God? That is not to say that we have rejected God, but perhaps unknowingly, perhaps to avoid God as Jonah did, or perhaps we thought we could do something on our own, rather than in cooperation with God. The two disciples are journeying away from Jerusalem out of fear. Have there been times in your life when you have strayed from God out of fear? Those are times that allow us to reflect on our dependence on God and the trust we place in God. Notice in their time of wondering it is Jesus who seeks them, it is Jesus who desires to bring them back into relationship with God. Jesus desires to bring us back in relationship with God when we wonder or do not trust God as we should.

As Jesus walks with them, he asks them what they are discussing. They are in disbelief that this stranger would not know what just occurred in Jerusalem. The disciples recount what happened to Jesus at the crucifixion and Jesus relies, "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" This may seem harsh; however, Jesus points out that they just knew the "data" for what happened, they did not *believe*. Christians are called to live a life of faith and belief in the mystery that is God. That does not mean that we don't question our faith, that is fine, that is how we learn, but it should not prevent us from believing. Sometimes we need to simply pray, "Lord, help my unbelief."

Lastly, Jesus sits with them and feeds them with his body and blood as he did at the last supper. Their eyes were opened to his presence and the mission to which Jesus calls them. No one in the bible has an experience of God without being sent by God. This reminds us of the transformative power we encounter in the sacrament of the Eucharist. Have you experienced the transformative power of the Eucharist? Through the sacramental life of the Church, Jesus invites us into a relationship with him. This relationship is a two-way street, Jesus invites us and we accept by co-operating with him. The most significant way we co-operate is when we love all those we encounter, family, friends, co-workers, strangers, etc. Again, this love is when we will the good for the other person without any concern of cost or what we receive in return. This is a dimension of the mission to which we are called.

As we journey this life, we benefit from being aware of our spiritual self. We become aware of God's presence when we are spiritually aware. Trust the mystery of God, be open to what Jesus reveals to you, be aware of God's presence through prayer and the sacramental life of the Church. This is the relationship we are called to through baptism. I pray that this Easter season bears the fruits of trust, revelation, and the experience of God's presence for each of you.
