

GOSPEL REFLECTION, ADORATION and MINISTRIES

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today we begin the Advent season, a season of watching and waiting. The theme of watching and waiting is found throughout the bible from Genesis to Revelation. The first reading from Isaiah reminds us, "No ear has ever heard, no eye ever seen, any God but you

doing such deeds for those who wait for him" and in the gospel Jesus tells us, "Watch, therefore; you do not know when the lord of the house is coming..." How are we to understand this idea of watching and waiting?

For us as Christians, Advent is a season in which watching and waiting has a dual meaning. Of course, we are watching and waiting alongside Mary and Joseph for the birth of Jesus, which is the focus of the 3rd and 4th weeks of Advent. However, the 1st and 2nd weeks of Advent call us to be watching and waiting for the second coming of the Lord. For both meanings, watching and waiting is not a passive event, rather it calls us to actively prepare ourselves.

We do not know the day or time our earthly body will die and we do not know the day or time when Jesus will return, but we must be prepared for both. We may find it odd that our earthly death is a theme for Advent. The reality is, is that death is a theme for every season. We profess that Jesus "will come again to judge the living and dead." This is precisely why we must be prepared. Advent is a season in which this reminder is highlighted for us.

We prepare ourselves by praying for the strength to live according God' will for us; by reconciling ourselves to others and to God the Father; and by living a life of humility that reminds us that we are called to serve others for the glory of God.

During this Advent season may we be active in our watching and waiting, so that when we leave this earth or Jesus returns we may be found worthy to live eternal life in the presence of our loving God who came into this world as one of us for our salvation.

May the peace of Christ be with all of you. Deacon Nick
