



- the KOC is a global Catholic charitable organization for men around the globe with millions of members. It was started by Fr McGivney in 1882 in nearby New Haven, Connecticut. St Jude's council is almost 25 years old.

- we pick up litter along Williams and Whiteview Rd from LaSalle to the car wash each Spring and Fall.

- Each year we buy 144 brand new coats from the international KOC? All coats go to children in our parish and local community.

- we buy bibles presented to every child baptized at St Judes

- we sponsor a child at St Jude's School

- we support many other Parish programs and activities

- we meet once a month for less than an hour. All activities are optional. Dues are \$25/year and includes a monthly magazine from the global organization.

t is amazing what can happen when we place our hopes in the things of God rather than the things of this world.

In today's first reading, we hear a story about King David who had received the favor of God. God had chosen this shepherd boy to become a king and he brought peace and prosperity to his kingdom. David

was troubled because while he lived in a luxurious palace, the Ark of the Covenant remained in a tent. So, David decided that this tent was too humble a dwelling for God, and he should build God a luxurious house. But God, through the prophet Nathan, gave David an unexpected reply.

David was thinking of God in human terms. After all, what sort of house could he build that would hold the Creator of the universe, this God who permeates the entire world, who subdues nations before him? How could mere humans provide anything for God?

Instead, God gave David a promise, which foreshadowed how He in-

tended to dwell with His people. It will indeed be through the House of David, which speaks not of a building, but of an eternal kingdom in David's line of descendants. A kingdom not of this world; But a kingdom where God lives and reigns in the hearts of all people.

So, our first reading teaches us that we should not lose sight of the transcendent nature of God. We can barely even begin to comprehend Him, let alone build a dwelling for God. God redefines David's house to mean His descendents and He promises to dwell with them and with us in His eternal kingdom that will emerge in this line of David.

In the Gospel today this promise is fulfilled in the annunciation as the Angel Gabriel tells Mary, that she has found favor with God, and that the power of the Most High will overshadow her, and she will conceive and bear a son, and she will name him 'Jesus', which means 'Yahweh Saves'.

Mary, even in the midst of confusion and doubt, let go of Her earthly hopes, and puts her faith and trust in the plan of God, and in His plan for her son. Mary's faith is affirmed by the sign, which is

> given to her in the miraculous conception of John by her cousin Elizabeth. As Mary goes to visit Elizabeth we are reminded of the distinction between the conception of Jesus and that of John. The child of Zachariah and Elizabeth, although conceived in their old age, will still be a child of this world.

> But, the Child of Joseph and Mary, transcends this world, and is truly the Son of God. Through Mary's betrothal to Joseph, He inherited the kingdom of David and He made this kingdom an eternal kingdom, which established the reign of God on earth.

So, as we wait in hope this Advent for the coming of our savior, let it be Mary's example of faith that guides our hopes so that we instill in our children virtues of faith, hope and love, and let our thoughts be filled with the wonder of this heavenly birth. As our transcendent God comes to dwell in our midst, may he bring peace and prosperity to all in this house.

May you all have Merry and Blessed Christmas and a Happy New Year


St. Jude Choir
