


The Most Holy Trinity

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Each year on the first Sunday after Pentecost the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, also known as Trinity Sunday. Although it wasn't until 1334 that Pope John XXII officially established the feast for universal observance in the Western Church.

Throughout salvation history, God is revealing God's self to humanity, and we catch little glimpses into the relationship of the Trinity, that is God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. As we read in the Catechism, "By sending his only Son and the Spirit of Love in the fullness of time, God has revealed his innermost secret: God himself is an eternal exchange of love, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and he has destined us to share in that exchange" (CCC 221). *God has destined us to share in that exchange.* That is what we reflect on today. How do we participate and have a relationship within the Most Holy Trinity.

In the early Church the Greek term *perichoresis* was used to describe the relationship of the Trinity. The Greek *peri*, means "around" and *chōreō*, means "to go, or come." As a compound word, it refers primarily to "going around" or "encompassing."

The Franciscan philosopher, theologian, and mystic St. Bonaventure (c. 1217–1274) described the Trinity with the beautiful imagery of "fountain fullness" of overflowing love. Picture three buckets on a moving water wheel. Each bucket empties out and swings back, inevitably waiting to be filled again. And it always is! This is the love that animates the Trinity. It is a self-emptying love, meaning the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit continuously empty themselves into the other only to be filled again by the other. Think of a circular motion of love. We are invited to share in this continuous loving relationship, through prayer, the sacramental life of the Church, and community. We are called to give of ourselves to all who we encounter for the glory of God. Take time to reflect upon this relationship to which God calls us and how you respond to the invitation. Let the continuous pouring out of the Trinity's love be an imagery that we can make reality. Be careful, this is not about an intellectual exercise, rather these images and descriptions are ways of humanity attempting to articulate the mystery of God. The Trinity is a mystery that we are invited to live and breathe in and to spend eternal life with. This occurs because the mystery of the Trinity gives us life and breath and gives us the hope of eternal life. May your hearts be open to accepting this invitation.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ may the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you.


Opening Prayer
