

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ



Today on the solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ we celebrate the great gift of the Eucharist that Christ has given us. We are invited to renew our devotion to spend time in contemplation and pray with Christ who is present to us in a very special way in the Eucharist and we are invited to receive His Body and Blood each week if not even more often.

At the turn of the millennium Pope John Paul II wrote a beautiful encyclical on the Eucharist with the hope that it would rekindle in us a Eucharistic amazement. He sought to help us recognize Christ more readily in the many forms He is present to us and especially in the Eucharist.

He wanted us to relive the experience of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus who 'recognized Him in the breaking of the bread'. They were so filled with faith from the experience that they returned beaming with excitement to share that experience with the others.

That is the power and grace of this sacrament when we take Jesus's words to heart, "this is my body, this is my blood" when at the last supper He changed the bread and wine and offered His body and blood to be given up for us.

In that action he made his paschal mystery present for all future generations to be embraced in the grace of redemption every time we celebrate Mass. When we receive communion the saving grace of His sacrifice is fully relived and "His blood is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins.

In Christ, God gave His own life's blood to us for our salvation. When we receive His Body and blood, we receive from his divine life and Spirit, we are comingled and so become Christ's body in the world.

Today, we are invited to ask ourselves, if we come to the Eucharist with the full expectation of encountering the Lord. Do we recognize the miracle that is happening in communion and do we feel enlivened and transformed? I believe we will experience this miracle if we truly come with our hearts open to receive all that Christ offers us in the Eucharist.

Many times, we do have an experience of grace while receiving communion when we try to be as present to Christ as he is to us. Just like the two disciples on the road to Emmaus we are compelled to respond when we experience the grace of Christ's presence. We strive to live out the mission that Christ gave us by bringing the Gospel to our homes, our workplaces and our communities. We try to follow His great commandment, to love one another as He loved us. The Eucharist provides all the strength we need to fulfill this mission.

As we live out the commandments Jesus gave us, we become Eucharist for each other, because our lives are poured out in service of one another, each time we care for the sick, each time we comfort the lonely or when we provide food or clothing or shelter for those in need. We become the reconciling face of Jesus when we forgive others, or we bring peace where there was conflict or we lead someone to come to know Christ.

We show the life-giving spirit of Jesus when we promote marriage and family life and when we speak out to protect the unborn and the elderly. So, as come to receive this precious gift of Christ's Body and Blood, let our minds and hearts be open to the miracle that unites us with Christ and with each other and let us once again be assured of His enduring presence with us.
