

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In today's Gospel we hear Jesus say, "The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." Yes, the focus here is that Jesus is sending out the twelve apostles, who we see as the priestly order, however this also means the laity, anyone who is baptized. We are all called to be co-workers in the vineyard.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops published a book in 2005 entitled *Co-workers in the Vineyard*. This book focused on lay ecclesial ministry, meaning those lay members who work or volunteer specifically for the Church. However, in the beginning of the book, the bishops recognize that all baptized laity are called to work for the Kingdom of God here and now. There is a role that we all have in God's Kingdom, not just the clergy or those in consecrated life.

The Bishops observe: "Lay men and women hear and answer the universal call to holiness primarily and uniquely in the secular realm. They are found 'in each and every one of the world's occupations and callings and in the ordinary circumstances of social and family life which, as it were, form the context of their existence. There they are called by God to contribute to the sanctification of the world from within, like leaven, in the spirit of the Gospel, by fulfilling their own particular duties." We are called to sanctify the world from within. Not within the Church, rather within society! In the store, in the workplace, at the sport games, in the home, etc.

In our Church we need more co-workers. No doubt we need more priests and deacons, but we also need more lay co-workers. Jesus' final command in today's passage is: "Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

Allow me to bring this into a relevant understanding: Go into East Greenbush, North Greenbush, Troy. Talk with those who have fallen away from the church and invite them back. Visit the sick at Samaritan Hospital, Albany Med, St. Peter's and surrounding nursing homes. Welcome those affected by poverty, homelessness, or unemployment. Go without cost you have received; without cost you are to give." This is what Jesus is calling the baptized to do as co-workers in the vineyard.

As we reflect on today's gospel, put yourself in the place of the apostles. Pray that God may strengthen and encourage you to go out beyond the walls of this church and be co-workers in God's vineyard.
