



6th Sunday of Easter

"I will ask the Father, and He will give you another Advocate to be with you always.", "I will not leave you orphans, I will come to you", these are among the most comforting promises that Jesus gave us. The readings this week recall these promises and invite us to think about how God is present in our lives. When we are baptized and we become children of God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit all come to make their home within us. Just as Jesus is in the Father and the Father is in Him, so we are in Jesus and He is in us. The way we know this is through the Spirit of Truth who reveals the Father's love to us just as Jesus did when he came among us. Yet, only when we respond to that love by keeping Jesus' commandments are we able to see Him and feel His presence with us.

Now, another way that God remains with us is through the strength he gives us to live as Disciples of Christ. After we have matured to the age of reason, we are given the same special strengthening in the Spirit that was given to our confirmandi just the other night. Through this anointing we are endowed with a number of gifts that empower us to share in the mission of Christ. Jesus sends us to bring the good news of His salvation to a world that is not only indifferent to it but is often hostile toward the people of God.

It seems that being a disciple of Christ becomes more difficult with every passing year. Our young people will have to defend the reasons for their faith among many of their peers who don't believe in God anymore; and with those who think they don't need the Church or organized religion.

They will be faced with powerful temptations when many of their peers choose to live together before marriage or stray from God's commandments in other ways that continue to grow more and more acceptable in our society. Only by remaining close to the Church and praying for council and fortitude and other gifts of the Spirit will they be able to resist these temptations.

One important point that we should not miss in the readings this week is that we help our young people resist temptation by remaining faithful ourselves to Christ's commandment of love.

Remember that we are able to see the Father and know of His love for us because He is in Jesus and Jesus is in Him. Now, in the same way, Jesus is in us and we are in Him. So, just as Jesus said, "When you have seen me, you have seen the Father", our youth should be able to see Christ, when they look at us, who are His church.

In a very real way, we reveal Christ to our young people and His love is shown through us. When we listened to the story of Philip in the reading today, we heard how he brought the Gospel to the Samaritans with such love that the Spirit of Truth was revealed with miraculous healings. The Samaritans received His teaching with great joy.

How much more will our youth grow in their faith when we demonstrate in our lives the Spirit of Love that lives in us? When we reach out to those in need that is the kind of witness to Christ which touches and heals others in the same way Jesus himself did.

So, as we draw near to celebrating Pentecost this year, let our love for Christ be demonstrated in the same way, so that the power of His Spirit might be revealed in us.
