



6th Sunday of Easter

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



On this seventh Sunday of Easter we hear a passage from the 17th chapter of John's Gospel. The 17th chapter is Jesus' prayer for us. If you have not read through this chapter or perhaps it has been a while, please take time to do so, it is a beautiful passage.

In his prayer, Jesus first gives gratitude and praise to God for the relationship he has with God the Father. This is a relationship to which we are invited. Jesus desires us to be in this relationship, to say "yes" just as Mary had said "yes" to God. This relationship is for our salvation, as Jesus says, "so that your son may give eternal life to all you gave him." This reminds us to give gratitude to God for the graces God bestows on us, in times of joy and times of struggle. We give gratitude to God for inviting us into relationship.

Then we become the focus of Jesus' prayer. Through Jesus' words we come to know how dynamic and alive the scriptures truly are, "...because the words you gave to me I have given to them, and they accepted them and truly understood that I came from you, and they believed that you sent me." Recall the creation story in Genesis, God spoke and the world was formed. God's word has power, not only at the beginning of time but now as well. Jesus' word has power which is still dynamic through the sacramental life of the Church, scripture, the Mass, and prayer.

In this prayer we are reminded of our need to read and pray through scripture. It is the living word of God, where we come to know God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. Not to know the Trinity in an academic way, but to know them in our hearts. It is through scripture that we come to know the Shepard's voice in our life. We are called to journey this life in relationship with the Trinity for the sake of our salvation. It is interesting that Jesus says, "I do not pray for the world," meaning he does not pray for the things of this world that distract us from him. The lures of the world that disorder our relationship with the Trinity. It is us whom Jesus prays for, not the things of this world.

Brothers and sisters, let us reflect this week on our need to read and pray through scripture. To pray in gratitude to God for the graces granted to us. May you come to know the presence of God in your life.


Opening Prayer
